Garden Update: Volume 2

December 21, 2012

Preparations for January/February planting are underway. Three main projects are in the works to make this possible.

Project 1: Garden Beds Prep Work

- Removing large rocks from garden bed
- Securing soil amendments
- Tilling amendments into garden beds

Project 2: Seed Planting

- Creating a garden plan
- Obtaining seed trays with soil (4 trays obtained 12/14/12)
- Purchasing additional garden seeds
- Planting seeds (Two Simonton students planted seeds in 256 pots 12/16/12)
- Delivering seed trays to a local nursery (4 trays delivered to greenhouse 12/17/12)
- Organizing events for Transplanting Day

## Project 3: Building Up a Compost Pile

- Collecting composting materials such as horse manure, chicken manure, leaves, untreated grass clippings, fruit and vegetable scraps, eggshells, coffee grounds, dryer lint, and shredded non-glossy newspaper
- Adding materials to compost bin
- Turning and watering compost pile as needed
- Obtaining plastic buckets to give people interested in composting

Many of the above referenced actions are on going. This listing just gives a basic plan of what is happening to revive Simonton's Garden of Awesomeness.
