Bond Frequently Asked Questions

The J.O. Combs Unified School District Governing Board has scheduled a special bond election for November 8, 2016 to address facility, transportation and technology needs. All registered voters living in the J.O. Combs School District boundaries are eligible to vote either through early ballots or voting at polling sites.

What is a bond?

A bond allows local voters to approve additional funding to use for capital items such as school buses, building repairs and renovations, new construction and technology. Bonds address the school district's capital needs.

Why is J.O. Combs requesting additional capital funds?

Over the past 7 years, J.O. Combs Unified School District has experienced a reduction of over \$7.6M in capital dollars. Because of the reduced state funding, school repairs have been deferred, older buses have remained in service, and technology has not been updated. Lack of acceptable facilities has impacted student programs and department efficiency. The increased capital funding will address the most immediate needs in these areas and will allow the district to plan for future growth.

How will the bond funds be spent?

The distribution of bond funds is as follows:

 School and building renovations and improvements 	\$6.6M
 Technology 	\$5.5M
 Student transportation (buses) 	\$3M
 Auditorium with classrooms and athletic storage facility 	\$8.6M
at Combs High School	
Maintenance transportation and district service facility	\$13.1M

What will be the cost of the proposed bond?

The estimated cost of the bond is \$7.23 per month on a \$100,000 home and would be funded by an estimated \$0.86 tax rate per \$100 of the net assessed valuation used for secondary property tax purpose.

How will the bond funds be distributed?

Funds raised through bonds go directly to the local school district, unlike state tax funds that are allocated to school districts throughout the state. Bonds offer local control to the community.

How can we be sure Combs will spend the money the way it was intended?

Each year, the school district administration proposes the annual budget, which is then reviewed, finalized, and approved by the community-elected governing board. The Combs District has received the Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting for the past six years.

Help Your Child Succeed in School: **Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early**

School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!

DID YOU KNOW?

- · Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- . Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- · Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- . Set a regular bed time and morning routine.
- · Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your child to her teachers and classmates before school starts to help her transition.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.



Our first month of kindergarten has flown by!! These wonderful children grow more each and every day. This month we have some fun plans to go with our five senses unit, so many fun things in fact we have two weeks dedicated to it!! Then we will move on to one of our favorite units dedicated to all things apples! We will talk about the life cycle and Johnny Appleseed, we will even make Crock-Pot apple sauce! Yum!! We are expanding our number knowledge with counting each day, building numbers, and adding and subtracting numbers. Here are some fun activities to try at home or on the drive.... count as high as you can, play rhyming games, first sounds of words, count all the certain kind of color vehicle while driving, or clean up toys by color. This helps the car ride or cleaning up go faster and encourages students to use new concepts from class in different environments. Keep up the amazing work!!

1st Grade News

Thank you so much for all your generous donations and a fantastic start to a new year! We have had a busy month in our First Grade classes. We have been focusing on learning our classroom rules and procedures. Students have also been focusing on the 7 habits through modeled instruction, practice, and leadership opportunities. All students have created a personal goal in their leadership notebooks.

For the month of September, we will begin science exploration on apples and learn about early civilization. In Math, we will be working on addition and subtraction equations, story problems, and unknown partners. In Fundations, we will be tapping out and writing our CVC words. The students will be learning trick words and digraphs. We will also continue working on word order and forming complete sentences.

We look forward to meeting with all of you to discuss your child's progress at Parent Teacher Conferences.

POPS Preschool

Our unit of study for the POPS preschool will be <u>All about</u>

Me and <u>My family</u>. We will be doing learning activities for the color; red and the shape; square. We will also be focusing on P and B for our sounds of the month and our concepts are big/little. See you at parent/teacher conferences!

2nd Grade News

In September, Second Graders will be finishing up their informational text unit focused on context clues and text features. Then they will begin a narrative story unit and practice locating characters, setting and plot. In writing, they will continue our narrative stories, and work on creating interesting topic and closing sentences. They will learn all about the different rules of plural nouns. They will also continue learning about our government and practice how to vote. In math, work problems of all types will continue to be the focus. Look for information regarding a field trip to be coming home soon.

3rd Grade News

We are off to a great start! In reading we have been studying character traits. When you read a book at home, have your student identify some of the character's traits. In math we have been working hard to learn our multiplication facts. Our goal for the year is that 100% of the students in third grade will know their multiplication facts through 12. The students have learned songs to help them remember their count-by facts. Have your student sing you the songs that they have learned. Make sure that you are practicing facts at home too! Thank you for everything you do at home to support your child. It does make a big difference!

4th Grade News

The fourth grade students will continue to work on, and keep track of, their personal and academic WIGs. A portion of this month will be spent talking about natural disasters including how they have helped shape Earth. Topics of discussion will include: glaciers, volcanoes, hurricanes, and tornadoes. In math, students will continue with place values and move in to multiplication. Students will learn to multiply two digits by up to four digits!

5th & 6th Grade News

5th Grade: The school year is officially under way! Students have been learning a lot about fractions this last month. When we are done with Chapter 1 we will move onto decimals. The students have been reading Lemonade War and have loved it! It ties so well into JA BizTown standards. Get ready parents! We are almost to our field trip date. September 27th is the big day. Students will take their knowledge of what they have learned in class and bring it with them to their field trip and apply those skills. Students always have a ton of fun. Can't wait to see you there!

<u>6th Grade:</u> The school year is in full swing, and students have completed their first month of the sixth grade! We have been studying theme, point of view, and plot development, which has helped us strengthen both our reading and writing skills. Students have also been applying their knowledge of fractions and decimals to real-world situations, as well as practicing their ability to fluently add, subtract, multiply, and divide fractions and decimals. We are loving the lessons and activities that go along with JA BizTown, and we are excitedly awaiting our field trip. The big day is October 18th! The students are so excited to apply their knowledge of economics and money management during their trip to BizTown.

Mrs. B's PE Class

Physical Education is learning to be physically active. Please remind your child to dress for activity on scheduled P.E. days with appropriate foot wear. Ideal shoes are athletic type, properly fitting, with a rubber sole and covered toes. Shoes must stay on the feet during activity. **Students wearing flip**



flops will not be allowed to participate in running activities and will lose participation points for the day. Three days of nonparticipation will have the result of an N on the report card. I encourage proper hydration so feel free to send a water bottle to class as the line at the drinking fountain can be long. Students will not be excused from P.E. unless a signed note or email from the guardian is sent to me before class. Voice mails may not be received before class time so email is a much better option. Please feel free to communicate any concerns, ideas or questions you may have about our program. Parents are invited to come and participate with their child anytime. Students will have the opportunity to experience cardio vascular, strength and flexibility exercises along with sport activities. This sampling of activities is to give students the knowledge to expand on physical activity throughout a lifetime.

Each class will begin with a warm-up to get everyone moving. We will then proceed with 7-10 minutes of aerobic, strength and flexibility exercises. The remainder of the class will focus on a skill and/or a game for a brief experience of various sport activities.


