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
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A Message From Principal Stimatze's Desk



Happenings in the classroom....









February will be full of exciting new things in Kindergarten! We will be celebrating Valentine's Day with fun academic centers in Math and studying Arizona for Arizona's Birthday. We will be learning all about the branches of the government and researching various Presidents of our country. We will also be learning about the importance of dental health and how to take care of our teeth. In FUNdations we are becoming masters on short and long vowels and continuing to add words to our sight word list. In math we are breaking down teen numbers and starting to find number partners.

FIRST GRADE

Hello Families!

February will be a very busy month! We will begin our projects for the sci-tech festival, be on the look out for information about what we have planned. Valentine's parties will be fast approaching. Teachers will send out a list with the names of each student if you choose to send cards with your child.

- In Fundations we will be working on words with blends and reading sentences that contain these words.
- Students will be expected to begin reading test questions on their own about the stories we read in class. Keep reading every night!
- Students will be finding missing addends in equations in math.
 - Our writing focus will be expository compositions.
 - Fundations and math homework will be a similar format. Be sure to practice timed reading for 1 minute each night!
 - We appreciate your support and please feel free to contact us with any questions, comments, or concerns.

SECOND GRADE



- This month we will begin working on our Sci-Tech Festival projects!
- In Fundations we are working on open and r-controlled syllables.
- In Reading we are working on main idea, and continue to explore informational text by comparing two texts on the same topic.
- We are working on expository writing using our Write From The Beginning curriculum.
- Our math focus is measurement and double digit subtraction with and without ungrouping.
- We have begun to send home weekly fluency passages to work on with homework.
- Please make sure your child is reading 25 minutes each night.
- We are looking forward to meeting with you all this month at Parent/Teacher Conferences.

- Time is flying by! We are heading into the latter part of the 3rd quarter.
- Math: The students will be exploring place value. They will brush up on their addition, subtraction, regrouping, and ungrouping skills.
- ELA: Third graders will use skills to research nonfiction and informational resources to become experts on pivotal people in American history. Students will read lots of biographies and be able to discuss important text features that assist with research.
- Social Studies: Students will learn all about famous, influential people who impacted American history during the Civil War Time Period.
- Science: Third graders will become information experts on famous inventors, and elaborate on important technology and inventions that formed modern American society.
- Thank you for your support at home. We looking forward to seeing you at conferences.

FOURTH GRADE

- We cannot believe how quickly this year is flying by!
- Please continue to check Jupiter Grades for grade updates, Class Dojo for behavior updates, and backpacks for important flyers.
- In math we are still working through fractions and decimals. We have been working on comparing fractions on the number line, equivalent fractions, comparing fractions with unlike denominators, relating fractions and decimals. comparing decimals, and understanding decimals that are greater than 1.
- Please continue to have students practice math facts at home.
- In ELA students will be working on analyzing first and second hand accounts in non-fiction texts. Please make sure students are completing their assigned 25 minutes of reading every night.
- In science students have been working on their pollution project. Students created a wind powered vehicle, using only a few materials. These vehicles were made to only be powered by wind:)

We went to visit the middle school a few weeks ago and they met the counselor there. The counselors will also be visiting on February 7th to discuss course selection and go over available electives and courses of study.

Young Coyotes

Young Coyotes daycare services children ages 3-5 years old and combines play and learning in a child centered environment where exploration is encouraged. Children are provided opportunities to grow socially, emotionally, and academically through hands on activities involving music, art, and dramatic play. Young Coyotes is taught by a veteran preschool teacher with 20 years experience in early childhood. We now have 2 schools that will have our Young Coyotes program, Ranch Elementary and Ellsworth Elementary. Young Coyotes is licensed by Department of Health Services and approved by the Department of Economic Security. Children must be potty trained and current on shots. Parents must provide a sack breakfast and/or lunch.

Hours of Operation: Monday- Friday from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. not including school holidays.

Pricing: Parents have a choice of either full or part day options.

Half day \$20 per day or \$75 per week Full day \$40 per day of \$150 per week

Remember we still serve both Breakfast and Lunch on Parent Teacher Conference Days. We will serve them all an early lunch before we send them home.



Art and Math

Art and math have a lot in common with each other. In fact you can see the math in art and the art in math! Patterns, shapes, geometry, symmetry, spatial reasoning,, etc... are all a part of the arts (visual art, music and dance), as they are of mathematics. Have your kids use tangrams(you can print templates online) to create beautiful art projects and ask questions such as how many squares, circles, quadrilaterals, hexagons etc. did it take to create your artwork? ACADEMIC COACHES CORNER

In January's newsletter we talked about setting academic goals with your children. "By knowing what they want to achieve, they know what they have to concentrate on and improve. Goal setting gives students long-term vision and short-term motivation."

After you've set goals with your child you will want to check in with them and give them feedback on their progress toward their goal. Some key things to remember when discussing your child's progress with their goals are:

- Be as specific as possible. Tell them what they are doing well and what might need improvement.
- The Sooner the Better. Immediate feedback provides a larger increase in performance toward the goals.
- Present Feedback Carefully. The way feedback is presented can have an impact on how it is received. Staying positive and assuming progress is happening will keep them engaged.
- Involve Learners in the Process. Encourage your child to monitor their progress toward their goal.


