Kindergarten at Ellsworth is off to a great start! We are learning routines, procedures and rules in our classrooms. We are making new friends and have began our Citizenship Unit. In this Unit we are learning how to be a good citizen in our community and school. We are learning the Pledge of Allegiance and the Character Pledge. We are also talking about germs and how to stay healthy. The students are participating in a "glitter germs" science experiment to see how germs are spread and practice the best way to wash our hands. In ELA we are learning letters: t, b, f, m, and n. We are practicing how to hold our pencil and use scissors. We are also learning about how to draw a character and setting. In math, we are practicing how to make numbers 1-5 with pictures, counters, and drawings. Overall, we are having a fantastic start to the year! Looking forward to a wonderful September!

- Thank you for your continued support from home.!




- What a fabulous start to the school year in third grade! Now that our procedures and policies are in place, our students are ready for a successful academic year.
- Math: We have mastered expressing multiplication equations through equal share drawings and arrays. This has helped students transition into practicing division using unknown factors. Now that we have 5s and 2s countby's memorized, we will continue practicing our new multiplication and division skills with 10s and 4s.
- ELA: Character traits are our main focus, and students are making real-life connections
 to Beverly Cleary's spunky Ramona Quimby. Students are analyzing by examining
 character's feelings, actions, thoughts, and sayings, which leads to a deeper
 understanding and connection to literature.
- Social Studies: Third grade is so excited to dive into our study on citizenship, where we
 discuss what makes a strong member of our community. We will also research basic
 social issues.

FOURTH GRADE

- Thank you to the families that attended our Open House. It was great seeing all of the friendly faces!
- The 4th graders have been working hard learning the policies and procedures we have in place this school year.
- Being departmentalized has been a change for the kiddos but we have to say it has already had its benefits!

Sixth GRADE



In ELA, our students worked on understanding theme and how it is identified in narrative text. We read several short stories so the students could analyze the text and find the universal message. We have also been working on Point of View and will be comparing these different Points of View in narrative texts.

In Math, students have been working on long division as well as multiplying and dividing decimals. We have started examining equivalent fractions and decimals and will begin multiplying and dividing fractions, decimals, and mixed numbers. The students finished up their math tiles, where they depict how they see math in the real world context.

This month we'll be getting to know each other through ice breakers and cooperative games.




Technology

Young Coyotes

Young Coyotes daycare services children ages 3-5 years old and combines play and learning in a child centered environment where exploration is encouraged. Children are provided opportunities to grow socially, emotionally, and academically through hands on activities involving music, art, and dramatic play. Young Coyotes is taught by a veteran preschool teacher with 20 years experience in early childhood. We now have 2 schools that will have our Young Coyotes program, Ranch Elementary and Ellsworth Elementary. Young Coyotes is licensed by Department of Health Services and approved by the Department of Economic Security. Children must be potty trained and current on shots. Parents must provide a sack breakfast and/or lunch.


Hours of Operation: Monday- Friday from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. not including school holidays.

the end of August. Fill it out on line at jocombs.org under Departments/Food service.






Please Note the Price has Changed for Lunch this year
