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
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

March will be a fun and busy time for Kindergarten! We are very excited to begin our Dr. Seuss Author Study that will kick off with a celebration for Dr. Seuss's Birthday. We will be also begin studying farms in order to prepare for our field trip that will take place in April. In FUNdations we are learning all about digraphs and how to use them in our reading and writing. We are breaking apart sentences and practicing how to read them fluently. In math we are beginning to solve more difficult story problems and creating number partners and number sentences for 10. We are looking forward to starting off our last quarter of school on a great note!

# FIRST GRADE

# SECOND GRADE



Thank you for visiting with us at Parent Teacher Conferences! It is always wonderful seeing everyone again and discussing your amazing kiddos! We will be starting March with Read Across America, in honor of Dr. Seuss. There are many exciting events in store during the first week. Stay tuned for more information on these events. In Fundations, we are beginning to learn about "r-controlled" vowels and how to mark them in a syllable. In reading, we are working on making inferences in a story, reviewing diagrams, and reading for information. In language, we are reviewing irregular noun plurals and proper nouns. For math last week, we have started exploring different methods of subtraction, and we will continue on by subtracting 2-digit and 3-digit numbers. For homework, please make sure your child is reading 25 minutes each night along with the passages. Thank you for your continued support from home! As always, please feel free to contact us with any questions or concerns.





- Third Quarter is flying by! Thank you for coming in for conferences. It's always a pleasure to talk about the progress being made in school.
- Math: We are in the wonderful world of place value, addition and subtraction, and applying our knowledge of mathematical operations to puzzling situations. Third graders are also using clues and strategies to navigate through two-step word problems.
- ELA: Our non fiction unit is coming to an end. The kids have had many opportunities to read biographies about people that have influenced our country.
- Social Studies: It has been very exciting to see the kids learning about American history during the Civil War and also the Civil Rights time periods. The have gained much knowledge about important events and changes throughout time.
- Science: WAHOO!!!! All 3 third grade classes had projects that won a spot in the SciTech Festival in February. The kids really enjoyed learning about the Engineering Design Process.

# FOURTH GRADE

Parents must provide a sack breakfast and/or lunch.

Hours of Operation: Monday- Friday from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. not including school holidays.


**Pricing:** Parents have a choice of either full or part day options.



#### **Testing**

Parents Testing season is upon us and as you know our students tend to get nervous/anxious. Here are just a few tips to assist you with helping your child deal with testing anxiety.

\*Practice at home with them reading and math strategies

\*Practice calming techniques like deep breathing, yoga, meditation

\*Have your child repeat each day positive affirmations(i.e. I am smart, I am good at what I do)

\* Write a letter to your child letting him/her know how proud you are of his/her achievement and encouraging them to do well on their test

By reading aloud to children and talking about the story, they learn that understanding a story is a process that occurs before, during, and after reading.

Before reading -Read the title and author - take a picture walk, talk about what you notice in the pictures. Brainstorm on the topic - talk about what you may already know, what might happen, or what you might learn in this book.

During reading- Hold the book so the pictures and words can easily be seen. Take time to talk about the character's actions and feelings in the story. Talk about what you have learned so far in the story.

After reading- Talk with your child about one or more of the following; Explain your favorite part and tell why. Share connections made to the story. Discuss the most important thing that happened in the story and tell why. Non-fiction text- Discuss information you have learned from the book?
