## **Registration Information**

- 1. Registration begins in the Counseling Office of any YUHSD school.
- Students must enroll in a specific course and indicate <u>which semester</u> is needed. Indicate alternate course(s) in case your first choice is filled.
- 3. Students are not registered until <u>ALL</u> registration fees are paid.
- 4. Students are to be on campus only during their scheduled class time.

## **Tuition**

Tuition for traditional Summer School is \$10.00. Tuition must be paid in full **(CASH, CREDIT/DEBIT ONLY)** at the campus bookstore. There is no provision for loans or payment plans.

#### <u>Meals</u>

Breakfast and lunch will be served free of charge. ## <u>Credit</u>

Summer School classes earn one-half credit, equal to one semester of high school credit during the regular school year.

Students should verify classes needed with their counselor <u>before</u> May 21, 2015. If students are unsure about classes to be taken, they should get a copy of their transcript from the registrar at their high school.

#### <u>Attendance</u>

Attendance during Summer School will be monitored. Regularly attending school is important to a student's academic achievement. Students who are absent from school miss out on the opportunity to get assistance from a classroom teacher and other students. While students may continue to work on their assignments from home, it is expected that students will take exams on campus during the school day. Students who do not demonstrate progress in their assigned course may be dropped from Summer School.

#### <u>Refunds</u>

- 1. No refunds will be issued after Summer School starts.
- 2. All refunds will be handled by check, which will be mailed from the District's Business Office. <u>Refund</u> <u>checks may require four to six</u> <u>weeks for processing</u>.

## Conduct/Dress

Students are expected to conduct themselves according to the Student Code of Conduct as defined in the YUHSD Student Handbook. The Administration will handle all disciplinary violations.

## **Health Services**

**NOTE:** There will not be a nurse or other health services available during Summer School. In case of emergency, attempts will be made to contact parents. In extreme cases, professional emergency medical help will be called and the user of the service will pay all costs. **Please notify the Principal's office in writing of any medical conditions that may require special attention.**
