  - Timely information
  - Curriculum may be reviewed at the office at any time.
  - The forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress.
  - State proficiency levels that students are expected to meet in order to graduate.
- Parent-School compact will be included in the 2008-09 Student Handbook. Parent Compact includes:
  - Entire school's responsibility to provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables students to meet the standards
  - Parent' responsibility for supporting their child's learning (i.e. attendance, homework, TV, volunteering, participation in decision making)
  - Student' responsibility
  - Process of on-going communication with teachers and parents to discuss compact relating to student achievement through conferences, frequent reports, classroom visits and observations, and reasonable access to staff.
- An avenue for parent suggestions and concerns will be made available and the school will consider all input as it pertains to overall school improvement efforts.
- Share information with parents about topics such as:
  - The State's AIMS requirements
  - Academic content standards
  - How to communicate with the school
  - Tools on how to help their child's achievement.
