The goal is to help ELL students learn English quickly and move into mainstream classes with the depth of English Knowledge necessary for rigorous class work.



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Qualification for ELL Program at PUSD 8

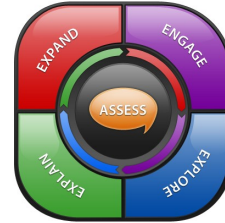
1. Upon enrollment at PUSD schools, Arizona state requires all students to have a Primary Home Language Other Than English Form (PHLOTE) completed.

- Answered a language other than English to one or more questions, the student will be assessed with the Arizona English Language Learner Assessment placement test (AZELLA).
- If the student receives Proficient results, the student is not eligible for ELL services.
- If the student receives other than Proficient results, the student is eligible for ELL services.
- If a student transfers in to PUSD 8 from another Arizona school with an ELL History or a current ELL status, the student is eligible for ELL Services.



ELL Program 1: Structured English Immersion (SEI) Classroom

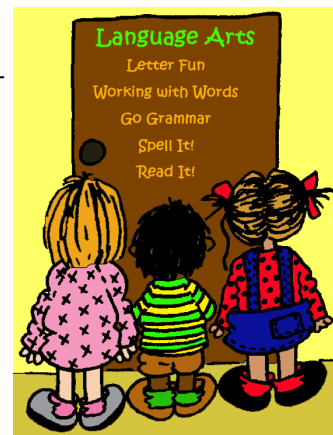
- 4 hours of English language development (reading, writing, grammar, oral/vocabulary)
- Lessons based on English language proficiency standards
- ELL students only
- Highly qualified teacher
- Instruction and materials in English



ELL Program 2: Individual Language Learner Plan (ILLP)

This ILLP is for schools with 20 or fewer English language learner (ELL) students.

- Identifies English language proficiency standards for each quarter of school
- Various teachers address each area of English language development (reading, writing, grammar, oral/vocabulary)
- Progress reviewed quarterly
- Instruction and materials in English



What Happens When my Student Becomes Proficient?

When a student scores “Proficient” on the Spring AZELLA Reassessment, he or she will be exited from the English language learner program.

You will receive a notification of Reclassification letter advising you that your student will enter the mainstream classroom in the next school year.

Your student will be monitored for two (2) years following his or her exit from the ELL program to ensure continued academic success.
