Last month, we brought you this mural on the left and challenged you to identify on which PUSD campus it is located and the story behind it. How did you do?

The mural is on Lake View Primary's campus at the main entrance to the building. In 1986, Page Elementary was split into two K-5th grade schools to accommodate the over

1200 students causing now-Desert View Intermediate School to burst at the seams.

Lake View Elementary was just over 5 years old when their art teacher won a 3-year grant to have an artist-in-residence visit the school for a week each year. Remember the quilt from 1992? It's still hanging in the Lake View library!

From afar, the mural depicts Rainbow Bridge and Lake View, along with our Page and Navajo communities.

Up close, every student in the school created a mold representing their families, schools, sports, and other interests. If you were a student at Lake View then, can you find your contribution?

A Common Thread: Maintaining Excellence

A walk on the Navajo Reservation, around Glen Canyon National Recreation Area, and in and around Page reveals that we live in a very special place. Sacred to the Diné and breathtaking to the millions of visitors who pass through our land each year, our landscapes are some of the most photographed worldwide.

While that beauty is known, you may not have the time taken appreciate the beauty of our school campuses as well. The gorgeous and sprawling 122 acres that make up Page Unified School District meticulously maintained by our Maintenance, Custodial, and Grounds Departments, directed by Kris Swatski.

Mr. Swatski leads a crew of 30 employees who provide maintenance and repairs to our six school district grounds, Transportation & Warehouse grounds, and baseball/soccer fields at the Sports Complex. On a daily basis, Swatski's put crew their electrical, construction, plumbing, landscaping, painting, and irrigation skills to use as well as

coordinate and complete ongoing large projects like air conditioning and roof repairs, installation of wheelchair ramp access to the Lake View playground, and renovating Page Middle School's front office. When major emergencies occur like the Page High School fire in 2013, flooding, or air

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conditioner failure, it is our Maintenance, Custodial, and Grounds crews who are part of the clean up and repair.

What was once a partnership with the City of Page to maintain Birch Circle and other public fields, PUSD's grounds crews are now solely responsible for irrigating, weeding, mowing, and edging all the grass you see around the campuses and ball fields.

These three departments have an operating budget which has been steadily decreasing each year as Arizona's state legislators change school funding and limit how monies can be spent. When you walk around campus, you'll

notice that our employees take great pride in their work, are able to do much with limited resources, and offer our students an environment that is both safe and beautiful.

time and environment wear on our playgrounds, parking lots, vehicles, swimming pool, fields, building roofs and paint, there is a growing need to make capital (facilities improvements and equipment). Where the Arizona legislature makes cuts to such funding, our local funding sources have traditionally stepped up to address capital improvements to our schools. **PUSD** continues to keep a watchful eye on our state legislature and on-going litigation about funding as we hope to take the steps necessary to maintain the excellence that Swatski's crews achieve for our students and Page as a whole.

The next time you are on campus, please notice that the pride, history, and beauty of our surrounding landscapes are reflected in the pride, history, and beauty of our schools and enhanced by our Maintenance, Custodial, and Grounds crews.
