### HB 2732 "Move on When Reading"

In May 2010, voters passed Proposition 100. Part of the proposition was a requirement that all third graders in the school year 2013-14 will be required to pass the AIMS reading test in order to be promoted to the next grade level. Parents of students in grades K-2



who are substantially deficient in reading will receive written notification each quarter. It is our hope to help parents know if their child is substantially deficient in reading.

Also, it is our intent to provide information on how Hassayampa teachers are working with your children to get them up to level to pass the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade AzMERIT reading test. In addition, Hassayampa will provide parents with specific information on the deficient areas of reading along with strategies parents can use to help their child at home. To learn more about your child's progress, please attend our APTT meeting schedule October 19 and 20 and contact your child's teacher. Together, we can achieve success for your child!

#### Synergy

Teachers are using the new Synergy gradebook to calculate students' grades electronically. Synergy is the new student management system used by the Wickenburg Unified School District to keep student information, like attendance. One component of Synergy is the teacher gradebook. There are many advantages to using an electronic grade book. Teachers have access to information about their students' assignments, missing assignments, grades, class averages, and up-to-date grades.

The use of Synergy also allows information to be shared with parents through ParentVUE. With a user ID and password, parents can have the ability to see their child's grade for each subject, missing assignments, and grade for a particular assignment plus many other things. You can have this information automatically emailed to you on a weekly basis. This system can help a parent know how their child is doing in school and this can be done from your computer at home or work via

the internet. When you come for parentteacher conferences or any time, please stop by the front office for assistance in getting more information on this useful tool.

It is difficult to believe that we are nearly at the close of the first quarter of school! Although it seems like school just began, we have already accomplished so much. While visiting classrooms, I have been impressed by the material being presented to our Hassayampa students. Our students are actively involved in their learning. As you know, as of September 19, we have had quite the construction project in our parking lot area. Although the parking lot wasn't expected to be closed, it has been determined to be necessary. It will be closed starting Wednesday, October 5<sup>th</sup> through Fall Break.

**Drop-off & pick-up by car** will continue to be on <u>Tegner St</u>., behind the WEC (round gym). Staff will be on duty for students to enter through the back gate. For their safety, students are not be permitted to cross the street at any other point along Tegner. For the safety of all students, please adhere to the suggested flow of traffic. School starts at **8:00 and the gate will close at 8:00**, you will need to park in the Town Lot and walk your child into school using the front entrance. School dismisses at 2:35. Please plan to **pick up by 2:45**. At that time, the gates will be closed and students will be brought to the front office.

If you would like to **park**, please use the **town parking lot** on Valentine/Coconino Street then walk your child to the school entrance. At this time, the afterschool program (4:00 or 5:00 p.m.) as well as Power Hour (7:00 a.m.) will use the corner of the front entrance for pick-up and drop-off. A staff member will walk students to the corner to be picked up. If you are late, you will need to park in the Town Lot and walk to the school office. Fortunately, this will be for only three days.

Once again, the construction project is expected to go through Fall Break, but the end result for temporary inconvenience will be a newly surfaced parking lot with a safer entry for students, buses, and emergency vehicles. Additionally, the flooding issues will be alleviated which makes everybody safer. I appreciate your patience during this process.
