

AIMS Scores Released

Last spring, students in grades 3-5 were tested with AzMERIT. The assessment is a standards-based assessment in English Language Arts which includes reading, writing, reading, and math. Results were mailed home in July. Parent resources are available on the Arizona Department of Education website.

Throughout the year, we will focus on improving instruction and student understanding. Our time spent in implementing Eureka Math should pay off with an increase in student success. Additionally, we have identified time in the schedule for teachers to provide more writing instruction. Keyboard Navigation is one technical item for us to focus upon during the school year as well. Computer time will be allotted during library time.

NCLB Parents' Right to Know

As a parent of a student in the Wickenburg Unified School District #9, under the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001, you have a right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct your child. The No Child Left Behind Act gives you the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- Whether the State of Arizona has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subject he or she teaches.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency permit or other provisional status by which state licensing criteria have been waived.
- The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- Whether any instructional aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

School Hours

Students may arrive at school as early as **7:45 a.m**. Parents wishing to walk their children to class are welcome to do so. At 7:45 parents may enter the main building and take children to classrooms. The doors between the office and the classrooms will remain closed until 7:45. Thank you for your cooperation! Classroom instruction **begins at 8:00 a.m.** Students are considered **tardy at 8:05 a.m.** It is important for students to be on time and ready for school each morning. **If your child will be eating breakfast at school, please ensure that they arrive in time to get breakfast, eat, and make it to class.**



Dismissal begins at **2:35 p.m.** with the Kindergarten through 2nd grade students. Third grade through fifth grade are dismissed at 2:40. Remember that **Friday dismissal is at noon!** If there are changes to your child's route home, please communicate the changes early in the day. Changes can be very confusing for students and for staff trying to keep track of many children. However, with good communication we can er



students and for staff trying to keep track of many children. However, with good communication we can ensure that everyone gets to where they need to be.

Parent Pick-up and Drop-off

The student drop-off in the morning is the parking lot in front of the stairs to the school.

Ms. Henneman is our morning greeter and looks forward to seeing you and your child. Ms. Henneman as well as other staff are not on duty until 7:45. Please do not drop your child off until you see someone on duty. For longer stops, please park and walk your child to the sidewalk. Students are not permitted in the parking lot without an adult. For those times that you may need to be somewhere early, please make arrangements for your child to either ride the bus or be taken to school by someone else.

In the afternoon, parents may wait in line for your child to be sent to your car or park in the lot and wait for students at the gate. Again, students are not permitted in the parking lot unless escorted by an adult. Please do not call your child from the car as they will not be permitted to enter the lot. This is for your child's safety. Please follow the traffic flow through the parking lot and be courteous to drivers and pedestrians. If you are in line waiting to pick up your child, do not leave your vehicle. Remain with your car and we will send your child to you.

Walkers and Bike Riders

In-town students may walk to school if parents choose. 3-5 students wishing to ride their bikes must obtain written parental permission and approval of the principal. Forms are available in the Hassayampa office. All walkers and bike riders are reminded to use crosswalks and other safety procedures (see Hassayampa Handbook for additional information – p. 17). Walkers and bike riders must enter from the front of Hassayampa the same as those who are dropped off by parents. The back entrance to Hassayampa is not an entry for walkers and bike riders.

A Note from the Health Station

Please remember that **ALL** medicines need to be brought to the Health Station by the student's parent. Parents are required to sign a consent form before medicine can be dispensed through the Health Station. Please also understand that leftover medicine must be picked up by the parent as well; students may NOT take medicine home with them.

Reading and Math Nook

DIBELS

Beginning of the year DIBELS testing took place during the first full week of school. Thanks to a dedicated assessment team as well as volunteers, we managed to assess the majority of our 405 students in just two and half days! Did you know that it takes approximately ten minutes per student? This is time well spent as the results from DIBELS help us to determine the reading needs of our students. DIBELS lets us know if a student is on the trajectory to reading success. After we had the results in our hands, the Hassayampa staff got together to make instructional decisions to move students to the next level. We also determined the extra supports needed for some students to get them on the right path to reading success.

"Move on When Reading"

Arizona Revised Statute 15-701 states that beginning this school year, 3rd graders who score **Minimally Proficient** on the **State Reading** test will be retained in 3rd grade. Parents of students in grades K-3 who are substantially deficient in reading will receive written notification each quarter. Parents will be informed if their child is deficient in reading as well provided information on how Hassayampa teachers are working with your child to get him/her up to level to pass the 3rd grade AzMERIT reading test. In addition, Hassayampa will provide parents with specific information on the deficient areas of reading along with strategies parents can use to help their child at home.

The bike is displayed in the building. Students have an opportunity to earn an entry ticket each time they pass their grade level Math Fact Fluency benchmarks given in October, December, March, and early May.

Math Fact Fluency Goals

Kinder - Count and identify #'s to 100

1st Grade - addition & subtraction facts to 10

2nd Grade - addition & subtraction facts to 20

3rd Grade – addition, subtraction, & multiplication facts

4th Grade - addition, subtraction, multiplication facts & division facts

5th Grade – multiplication & division facts & percentage/fractions/decimals conversions

The drawing for the bikes will take place in May during the annual Hassayampa Special Honors Assembly.

COUNSELORS CORNER

Character Counts! Our character is revealed by how we act when we think nobody is looking. During the first quarter, students will be learning about the 6 pillars of good character: Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring and Citizenship. Character education is necessary to help children develop the tools and strategies they need to make moral choices that make them proud.

Our character program is three fold. First, the teachers at Hassayampa talk about the pillars of good character daily in their teaching. Daily announcements also contain character messages. Each month, teachers choose a student from their classroom who exemplifies a certain pillar.



The second part of the character program is the STUDENTS! Our students practice these pillars of good character daily. When a teacher sees exceptional character, the student is given a "golden ticket", to put on the tic-tac-toe board located in the front office. Pencils and bracelets are awarded for tic-tac-toe. All golden tickets are put into a quarterly drawing for more prizes.

The third and very important part of this program is YOU, the adult who your child lives with. Each month, your child will bring home a letter explaining the character pillars. Please, "catch your child being a kid of character" and fill out paper. When this is returned to school, it will be posted in the hallway by Ms. K-P's office. This month, your child was given a "pillar" to be filled out and returned.



Next month, please look for a conversation "bubble" to return. Please have that conversation, praise your child, and let them know how proud you are to be the adult in their life!

Fitness Wonders and Stay & Play: Students get a chance to build character while participating in fun games and activities focused around health.

Technology Titans: Students will practice typing, learn basic coding, and learn to use Word Document and other handy computer skills.

Mad Science & Science League: 2nd and 4th grade students get a chance to further their learning on science standards from the classroom using hands-on projects and experiments.

Coyote Chorus: We have a lot of talent at Hassayampa. Unfortunately, the program capacity is limited. If you did not make it, please do not be discouraged!
