21st Century Community Learning Centers

Headquarters

Our 21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) programs for Quarter 2 began on October 24th and will run until December 16th. Please be advised you will need to fill out a new form if you would like your student to attend programs in Quarter 3. We currently have over 130 students attending after school programs one day a week or more. Reminders of what days your students have signed up for will be sent home Monday. Our after school bus leaves at 5:00, please let us know if you would like your student to ride the bus home after their programs.

Archery: Mr. Mo has begun our first session of Archery club. We have 10 new archers participating. Students are currently practicing their archery form and technique as well as working on strengthening their arms and core. Archery club meets every Tuesday from 2:50-4:00. Due to the nature of this club space is extremely limited. Students will get another chance to participate in Quarter 3.Board members are always welcome to stop by and see what Archery club is all about.

Art Club: This year there will be three sessions of Art Club, each lasting the quarter. The first group just completed projects like designing and making pillows, creating plaster flowers, crayon drips, and other creative endeavors!

Coyote Chorus: The chorus is well on its way for the 2016-2017 school year! We have 38 strong, respectful, talented, and happy singers. We had a fabulous performance at the Festival Friday for Australia. Now, we are gearing up for France Festival Friday, Christmas Tour, and a performance at the Town Tree Lighting ceremony.

Spelling Preparation: The 21st Century after-school program has started a spelling preparation club for Quarter 2. This club will help students prepare for our upcoming school-wide spelling bee. Students will get to practice spelling patterns, and proper etiquette while participating in a spelling bee. Thank you, Ms. Henneman, for taking on this program. Participation in this club is not mandatory for students to participate in the school wide spelling bee, but is highly encouraged.

The Quest: Mrs. Brown is hosting this enrichment program. Students will use higher order thinking and participate in challenging activities.

The Dark Knight: This is a chess program for beginners and students who have a little more experience. Students will learn the fundamentals of chess and how it relates to important math skills such as graphing, ratios, and place value.

Power Hour: This is our only before school program. It provides homework assistance to students so they can start their day off right. Students meet Ms. Lanz at the gate at 7:00 a.m.

APTT: We had our 2nd APTT meeting on October 19th for K-2, and October 20th for 3-5. This was a great time to build partnerships with parents and set attainable goals for students. Parents received their child's report cards as well as other grade level data. In addition to these group meetings, parents were given opportunities to meet with teachers individually. We will be hosting our next meeting on January 11th for K-2, and January 12th for 3-5.

The 21st Century coordinators would like to give a shout out to our cafeteria and transportation staff for helping our program run smoothly. We would also like to thank all the teachers who help make these programs happen as well as our partners Cops who Care who come in on Fridays to build relationships with our students.

Turkeys n' Tables

Wickenburg Unified School District will be helping needy families for Thanksgiving. The Turkey's n' Tables event is on **November 20** from 5-6 p.m. Special services and donations will be available such as: food, clothing, holiday photos, other social services, and Wickenburg resources.

Wickenburg Unified School District - Tax Credit Program

Arizona Revised Statue (A.R.S.) 43-1089.01 allows individual taxpayers to receive a tax credit up to \$400.00 (joint return) for payment to a fund set aside for extracurricular activities fees. Generally, any educational or recreational activity that is a supplement to the educational program of the school is considered to be an extracurricular activity. This is a dollar for dollar tax credit. It allows you, the taxpayer, to decide where you would like to put up to \$400.00 of your tax dollars to work. When it comes time to fill out your tax forms, you will receive a tax credit for up to \$400.00. It is a win-win situation for yourself and the school activities you support with your tax dollars. You do not have to have a child in school so grandparents or anyone can also take advantage of this tax credit.

Questions and Answers:

What public schools and grades are eligible for the credit? Public schools that provide instruction in grades kindergarten through 12 are eligible for the credit. What is a fee paid for the support of extracurricular activities? A fee is a dollar amount paid to a public school for the support of extracurricular activities.

What are extracurricular activities?

Extracurricular activities mean school sponsored activities that require enrolled students to pay a fee in order to participate. Such activities may include, but are not limited to use of band uniforms, use of equipment or uniforms for athletics, or use of scientific laboratory equipment or materials. Any educational /recreational activities that supplement the educational program of the school.

If a school establishes a fund to pay for extracurricular activities, would a payment to this fund qualify for a tax credit?

Yes, the credit is authorized for fees paid by any taxpayer to a public school for the support of extracurricular activities.

Must a taxpayer have a child enrolled in order to claim the tax credit?

No, a taxpayer is any person subject to tax.

What is the claim limit for a married couple?

The credit claimed by married couples filing a joint return is limited to a maximum of \$400.00. Married couples filing separate tax returns can claim only one-half of the allowable credit on each return.

What kind of receipt will I receive for my tax return?

The school will issue a receipt that includes the school name, district number, taxpayer name, social security number, amount paid, date paid and description of the activity for which the fee was paid.

At Hassayampa Elementary, we currently have several extracurricular activities that we charge a fee. Some of our approved extracurricular activities are:

- Science Camp for 5th graders,
- Coyote Chorus,
- The Art Club,
- Archery Club, and
- Character Education.

Your tax credit donation will be used to provide children the opportunity to participate and also provide supplies, guest speakers, and field trips. If you would like to make a tax credit donation to any of these activities, fill out the enclosed form and send it along with your check to school.
