
At least once a month, your child will have a special Character Counts lesson in their classroom or during library time. LEAD Coyotes will be showing music videos and helping students understand kindness and good character.

21st Century Community Learning Centers

We have finished our first semester of our 21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) programming with over 200 students enrolled in at least one program before or after school.

New Programs

The 21st CCLC has added several new programs for third quarter. Information on these programs was sent out prior to Winter Break. As openings become available, additional information will be sent home with students. New programs include Theatre Club, AR Club, Young Authors Club, and Vision Strategists.

Theatre Club – Students will learn and perform skits with a focus on Language Arts standards with Ms. Henneman.

AR Club – Mrs. Macias is sponsoring a book club with a focus on helping students read and complete AR tests on various books.

Young Authors - Language Arts standards will be the focus of this club as they are used in a fun way to write in various contexts.

Vision Strategists – Ms. Cardwell will be playing higher order thinking brain games with students on Thursdays after tutoring.

Extended Studies - Each grade level offers weekly extended studies opportunities. These begin the Tuesday, January 17th. Students will meet with teachers after school on their designated days from 2:50-4:00 p.m. to work on their math and/or reading skills. Under our Raising Expectations policy, students who are failing core classes or earn a Minimally Proficient on Galileo testing are required to attend tutoring. Other students may also be invited for additional assistance. Invitations for tutoring were sent home prior to break. If you feel that your child is struggling, please contact your child's teacher to identify options. Hassayampa offers a variety of supports for students. A good time to discuss concerns with your child's teacher is during APTT and parentteacher conferences.

Hour of Code

Mr. Krueger's Technology Titans completed an online course where they used fun games to learn beginning level coding. Students also got to practice typing and Microsoft Office skills in this class as well.
