From the desk of the Principal

During this last month our third through sixth grade students were able to participate in an antibullying presentation titled "Just Stop It" #saveaskyler. The presenter was Mrs. Patti Wren. Patti is many things to our community including coach, educator, volunteer, mentor, and mother. Her son, Skyler, suffered from the affects of bullying until finally he could take it no longer. Mrs. Wren's presentation was powerful and opens opportunities to educate our students about this devastating phenomenon. The key to battling bullying is educating people about it and communication. I ask that you take time to discuss with your children what bullying is, as opposed to conflict, and discuss ways to communicate if/when children are bullied or witness bullying.

According to stopbullying.gov "Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time. Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, and excluding someone from a group on purpose." Conflict can often be confused with bullying, as it is similar, however, it differs great in that both/all parties involved have power to influence the situation. Students fighting, for example, as often quick to say they were bullied but we often find out that both students had the opportunity to change the course of the final outcome.

Whether truly bullying or conflict our goal is to help prepare students to be responsible adults. If you fear your child has been bullied or has bullied a fellow classmate please make an effort to contact your child's teacher or I to further discuss this matter.
