<p>Themes- 5 senses, fire safety, Fall (trees, leaves and apples), transportation, nutrition and community helpers</p> <p>Reading: -With prompting and support, ask and answer questions about key details in text -Recognize and name all upper and lowercase letters of the alphabet -Demonstrate basic knowledge of lettersound correspondence by producing the primary or most frequent sound for each consonant.</p> <p>Math: -When counting objects, say the number names in the standard order, pairing each object with one and only one number name and each number name with one object. -Count forward beginning from a given number within the known sequence (instead of having to begin at 1) -Writing numbers 1-10</p> <p>Writing: -Use a combination of drawing, dictating, and writing to compose opinion pieces in which they tell the reader the topic they are writing about and form an opinion. -Continuing practice of name writing</p> <p>Science: - The 5 senses theme will be a science unit for us in September -We will also discuss weather daily</p> <p>Social Studies: - Community helpers will be our social studies unit.
