## Kindergarten

Themes- Columbus Day, Maps & Globes, Night Creatures, Pumpkins, Halloween

### Kindergarten

Reading: -With prompting and support, ask and answer questions about key details in text

- Retell familiar stories.

-Identify characters, settings, major events

-Recognize and name all upper and lowercase letters of the alphabet

-Demonstrate basic knowledge of letter sound correspondence by producing the primary or most frequent sound for each consonant.

Math: -Correctly name shapes regardless of their orientations or overall size.

-Identify shapes as two- dimensional (lying in a plane, “flat”) or three-dimensional (“solid”)

-Writing numbers 0-20

Writing: -Use a combination of drawing, dictating, and writing to compose opinion, informative or explanatory text and narrative pieces in which they tell the reader the topic they are writing about.

Science: - Night creatures and pumpkins will be a science unit for us in October.

-We will also discuss weather daily

Social Studies: -Columbus day and Maps and Globes will be our social studies unit.

We will be doing activities, reading books, and assessing their knowledge.

Spelling, Rolling sight words, what punctuation do I need, listening center, sorting fall words/non fall words, listing words in ABC order, identifying 1 and 2 syllable words

Mid-Module 2 Assessment, counting on or taking from ten to solve result unknown and total unknown parts, strategies for solving change or addend unknown problems
