This month is parent teacher conferences to be held on October 13, 2016 from 1-4 and from 6-8PM at Lake View Primary. Please be aware of the report card changes we have made. Each grade level has grading standards that will be assessed and tracked for all 4 quarters. Your student may possibly receive a 1-Difficulty but by 4th quarter they could receive a 4 exceeds the standard expectations. Teachers should have samples of student work to share with you along with some data from formative assessments, DIBELS assessments, and classroom assessments.



Please discuss your child's strengths and weaknesses with the teacher. We know 15 minutes is not a lot of time, so if more time is needed, the teacher will ask to set up a phone conference, or another time to discuss your child's needs.

Remember that reteach/enrichment time has begun for our building. It is at 10:25AM and 2:15PM on most days. Kindergarten has selected different times due to support needs in the classroom. Do not take students out of school for appointments during these times. This time is focused instruction based on specific skill needs of our students. When they are not here, they do not get this focused explicit instruction in smaller groups with added support.

Halloween Parade!

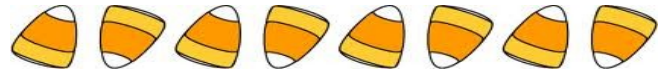

Counselor's Corner



October is National Bullying Awareness Month

What is bullying?

Bullying among children is aggressive behavior that is intentional and that involves an imbalance of power or strength. Typically, it is repeated over time. Bullying can take many forms, such as hitting and/or punching (physical bullying); teasing or name-calling (verbal bullying); intimidation using gestures or social exclusion (nonverbal bullying or emotional bullying); and sending insulting messages by phone or computer e-mail (cyberbullying).



Warning signs

Possible warning signs that a child is being bullied:

- Comes home with torn, damaged, or missing pieces of clothing, books, or other belongings
- Has unexplained cuts, bruises, and scratches

- Seems afraid of going to school, walking to and from school, riding the school bus
- Has lost interest in school work or suddenly begins to do poorly in school
- Appears sad, moody, teary, or depressed when he or she comes home
- Complains frequently of headaches, stomachaches, or other physical ailments
- Has trouble sleeping or has frequent bad dreams
- Experiences a loss of appetite
- Appears anxious and suffers from low self-esteem

What to do if you suspect that your child is being bullied?

If your child shows any of these signs, this does not necessarily mean that he or she is being bullied, but it is a possibility worth exploring. What should you do? Talk with your child and talk with staff at school to learn more.

1. Talk with your child. Tell your child that you are concerned and that you'd like to help.
2. Talk with staff at your child's school. Call or set up an appointment to talk with your child's teacher.

A note from our Lake View Primary Dean



Here some key points for effective communication with school personnel when you feel you need to address your child's educational/behavioral needs:

- Identify the appropriate school staff member (teacher, counselor, administrator, dean, etc.) you should talk to and schedule a face-to-face meeting at a time that is convenient for everyone.
- Prepare for a meeting or discussion with school personnel by writing down what you want to say and questions you would

like to have answered.

- Clearly state your concerns in a positive manner that indicates you want to work with school personnel to find a solution that is agreeable to everyone. Everyone is here for the benefit of the student.
- Stay calm and positive throughout the conversation. If your child is in meeting remember to keep an even key and be courteous to help show your child that everyone is willing to work together.
- Ask the school representative to clarify

any language used by educators that you might not understand. This happens more often than one thinks. Sometimes teachers are caught up in the educational language that they themselves don't realize that they are being misunderstood

- Thank the representative for working with you to meet the educational/behavioral needs of your child.
- In many cases a follow-up meeting or follow-up phone call will come from the staff here at Lake View.



Child Find

Are you concerned about your child's development or progress in school?

Some Children have difficulty learning or achieving developmental milestones. If you know a child who has a disability or one you suspect may have problems with learning, communication, vision, hearing, behavior, or motor control and coordination, ask for help.

Who can you ask for help?

Page Unified School District provides AzFIND referral services and/ or screenings to children birth through age 21 who may have a delay or disability. To refer a child contact Penni Case/Pam Cornaby at 928-608-4176. Anyone can refer a child; a parent, teacher, counselor, friend, relative, or the student. All referrals are considered confidential.
