EV-D68

You and your family can take basic steps to keep your child from getting and spreading EV-D68. To help avoid catching and spreading EV-D68, parents and children should always follow basic steps to stay healthy.

- Wash hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Avoid close contact such as kissing, hugging, and sharing cups or eating utensils with people who are sick, or when you are sick
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue or shirt sleeve, not your hands
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces, such as toys and doorknobs, especially if someone is sick
