C	DISCUSSION	 Kristy was looking for suggestions on how to get the parents involved in her program. Some suggestions were to have a "Parent Involvement" incentive piggy back with a game, and have food or prizes. PowerSchool use/instruction would also be a good topic. Having a "Club Showcase" showing what students have been up to in clubs might also be a good option. She explained to the group that tutoring is in session, but attendance needs improvement. For her grant, she needs to have 105 students to attend for 30 days (they don't have to be consecutive days). So far she has 25 students that meet the criteria. Transportation and snacks are part of her tutoring program. It was questioned that some students are punished for going to tutoring when they should be at sports practice.
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SITE COUNCIL MEMBERS COMMENTS AND CONCERNS

DISCUSSION	 The group appreciated the new "visitor parking" signs in the lot. Please remind teachers to put a dash or exempt for student grades instead of a zero. There is a conflict with the Prom and Morp being scheduled too close together. Could be a hardship on students/parents when having to buy formal attire for each event. There was concern about students keeping up grades with such late returns from sporting events. It was rumored that one of our sports teams had to have a police escort out of town after a game. It was brought up to have no sports events during Christmas finals. A concern was voiced up about not having transportation to the softball and soccer fields for non driving students. It was questioned if we would have more electives for next year. Possibly peer counseling?
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
