OFFICE OF NAVAJO NATION SCHOLARSHIP & FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE (ONNSFA)

The Office of Navajo Nation Scholarship & Financial Assistance (ONNSFA) was originally known as the Navajo Higher Education Office when it was established in 1972. The purpose of ONNSFA is to dispense financial assistance to eligible applicants who demonstrate a "need," based on income. The majority of ONNSFA funds are a federal P.L. 93-638 mature contract. Eighty percent of those funds are used for need based financial assistance with twenty percent set aside for academic scholarships and college developmental awards.

The ONNSFA has established agency offices in Tuba City, Ariz., Chinle, Ariz., Shiprock, NM, Crownpoint, NM and Window Rock, Ariz. Each agency is authorized to award or deny applicants and advise and counsel clients regarding their eligibility for financial assistance or scholarships offered by ONNSFA. All agency offices have access to Empower to track, award, and deny students so that decision can be made at the agency level. Toll-free numbers are available at each agency office. A website is available for students to apply online, download ONNSFA forms and review the policies and procedures and eligibility criteria.

Tuba City Agency

The Tuba City Agency office is located at the Bureau of Indian Affairs Western Navajo Agency Administration, Building No. 407, Rooms 112-117, in Tuba City, Ariz. Office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., or as scheduled by staff. The office is closed for all government holidays.
