Learning Center Grant. The 21st Century Community Learning Program was established by Congress to award grants to rural and inner-city public schools for the purpose of extending the learning day so that students have more opportunity to advance their academic success.

This program supports the creation of learning centers that provide academic enrichment opportunities during non-school hours. The program was created to help students meet state and local student standards in core academic subjects, such as reading and math, and it offers students a broad array of enrichment activities that can complement their regular academic programs

Some of our

enrichment programs include:

- Chess Club
- Weightlifting Club
- Battle Bots

The Freshman Intervention Program is a structured program that runs from Monday – Thursday 3:25 - 4:25 for the subjects of math, science and reading. All freshmen are invited to take part but it is a mandatory tutoring sessions for all students that have a D or F in one or more of their core subjects. The students are notified if their grades fall in that category and are assigned a tutoring class for the week. They can get out of the mandatory class simply by bring their grade up to a C or better. Our program also offers rewards for the student's attendance in our 21st Century classes. Some of the incentives include:
