February 16<sup>th</sup>-26<sup>th</sup>-High School Pre-Registration Occurs

February 29<sup>th</sup>-Pre-Registration Schedules are handed out to students

March 11<sup>th</sup>-Pre-Registration Schedules must be returned with a parent signature.

Please help us out by doing your part to review, sign, and return the schedules on time so our pre-registration data is accurate and we can build the best schedule for all of our students.
