

CAVIT Medical Assisting Program Year 2 Syllabus

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Objective:

The Medical Assisting program at CAVIT is designed to prepare students for a variety of careers in the medical field with the largest emphasis on Medical Assisting. Students attending the CAVIT MA program can earn free dual enrollment college credit through Central Arizona College which can be applied toward an Associate's degree in Medical Assisting or Allied Health programs.

Expectations:

1. All class time should be dedicated to learning the skills and tasks of medical assisting. Please complete work for other classes during the appropriate time.
2. The utmost courtesy and respect shall be given to all guest speakers or instructors.
3. Regular attendance is necessary for optimal success in the class. CAVIT attendance policies will be enforced.
4. Assignments are important part of the learning process. Be prepared to do assignments in class and spend whatever time is necessary to complete homework assignments outside of class.

NOTE: All assignments must be completed to receive credit. Late work will be accepted at the discretion of the instructor.

5. Make-Up work for students that have missed assignments due to absence is the responsibility of the student to obtain.
6. CAVIT Uniform will be worn on a daily basis, to include a wrist watch with a second hand. Wearing of the uniform is part of the requirement of the program and students will be graded.
7. Medical Assisting requires a lot of hands-on and practical training; all students are expected to participate in all exercises and will be graded on classroom participation.
8. Each student will be required to bring in a minimum of 20 clients to the Wellness Clinic per semester.

Instructional Methods

Active lectures, discussions, demonstrations, student practice, peer review theory knowledge and skills evaluated by instructor. Weekly vocabulary quizzes may be given, pop quizzes are possible. Module tests will be given throughout the semester. Test topics will be posted at least 3 days prior to testing. **Each student is required to complete a 40 hour practicum experience in a medical clinic during the time allotted for the experience.**

Note to students: The instructor reserves the right to change the delivery of the course content based on the needs of the class.
