### #1 Breakout Topic-Authentic Classroom Instruction

#### Best Practices Research:

Teachers emphasize learning in which students learn how to apply academic and technical content in a real-world situations. Rigor resides in combining career and technical education and academic skills to real-world problems.

- Report writing needed as students use inappropriate texting abbreviations and characters.
- Talks on making poor choices which affect future occupational opportunities.
- Law Enforcement to add courts to curriculum.
- Include quality job acquisition skills.
- Resume and interview training is essential training.
- Financial planning/budgeting instruction.
- Emergency situational awareness activity with all programs participating.
- Continue practice of business partners evaluating students' skills.

### #2 Breakout Topic - Work-Based Learning

#### **Best Practices Research:**

Work-based learning builds the kinds of skills and behaviors that are critical to success in the workplace and college. Employers are involved in the training and education of students.

- Continue efforts to have first year students complete job shadowing with second year students completing 40-hour externships.
- Invest additional time in preparing students for public contact.

- Consultation skills are needed to enhance communication in the workplace.
- Initiate a speakers forum activity in first year programs.
- Encourage participation in existing fire and law Explorer's programs.
- Partner with community agencies so students receive alternative work-based experiences (i.e. senior centers).

## #3 Breakout Topic - Student Leadership Organizations

#### **Best Practices Research:**

Through membership in CTSOs, students learn occupational skills and develop technical literacy. Students report higher motivation, engagement, career awareness and college aspiration as a result of participation.

 Enhance existing ambassadors program to include presentations at the home school.

- Provide interactions on how CTSO can work for students, not just focusing on competitions.
- Invite advisory members to CTSO events.
- Bring back alumni to speak on impact of CTSO involvement in their lives.
- Goal setting, both short term and long term, is needed. Have students define who and where they want to be.
