- ⇒ Don't look for patterns in the answer choices
- ⇒ Your first choice is usually the best choice

POPS



The POPS preschool classrooms will be learning all about shadows, reflections and spring in March. We will be focusing on the color purple and the shape of a diamond. Our concepts are over and under. We will also be learning the letters and sounds, S and Z. Help us reinforce our theme and vocabulary at home by reading books about our theme. It will be a fun month of exploration and learning.

Kindergarten

In Foundations, we have started reading and writing using digraphs. We will also be using our tapping skills and trick word knowledge to read phrases and illustrate sentences. Please look for more information about activities in your Foundations packets. Remember to continue practicing letter formation, as well. In math, we have been working on our fluency in addition and subtraction. We are also talking about seeing things in five groups as well as ten groups when we talk about teen numbers. You can help your student be successful by helping them with counting, simple math facts (1-8), number order and writing numbers correctly. Thank you for all you do at home to help your student be successful!



Second Grade



Thank you parents and students for doing such an amazing job on your animal reports! First Place winners were: Mrs. Gaylord: Gracie Solis, Mr. LaPorte: Vanessa Bailey! We can't believe it is already the 4th quarter of school. Students will continue to work hard on Time, Money, Fractions, and triple digit addition and subtraction. In reading, students will continue to understand, in more detail, the main idea of the stories being read. Students should be able to retell a story to you at home that include time order words (First, Next, Last or In the beginning etc). Please make sure your child is reading each night.

First Grade



Thank you to all the families who supported their students by attending student led conferences! The first graders worked very hard to share their growth with you. In Foundations this month, we will be working on closed syllable words and special vowel teams - ee, -ea, -ey, -oi, -oy. Please continue to practice trick words with your students nightly. It is important that they master these words by sight to become fluent readers. In math, students will begin to explore measurement by expressing length as a number of units. Students will use real world objects as units of measurement. Students will also celebrate Dr. Seuss' 113th birthday by completing an author study incorporated with fun activities.

Kinderprep

In March, we will be learning about "Shadows and Reflections." The children will be answering questions like: Why do we see shadows? What makes shadows change? What is a reflection and why can't we hold on to shadows and reflections? Our color this month is purple but we will also be learning about mixing colors. Our shape is the diamond. Our concepts are over and under/ light and dark. Our letters of the month are Jj, Pp, and Yy. Our numbers are 16 and 17. Our rhyming word families are -ell and -uck. Our math focus activity will be weight. Our author of the month is Eric Carle. Our caterpillars will be delivered after Spring Break and we will begin to learn all about the life cycle of caterpillars and butterflies.





Third Grade

Third grade will be "digging" their new science unit when we start learning more about the Earth's surface and how fossils are formed. We will also be discussing the point of view of the author in an informative text and focusing on key ideas and details in informative text in reading. In math, we will be reviewing all concepts that have been taught throughout the quarter such as: multi-digit addition and subtraction, elapsed time, and measurement.

Fourth Grade



Moving right along into March! In Math we are making connections between fractions and decimals then we'll begin studying measurement. In reading we are busy reviewing for our upcoming Galileo test and working towards AR goals. In science we are moving from magnets into electricity. Stayed tuned for information regarding 4th grades upcoming FIELD TRIP!

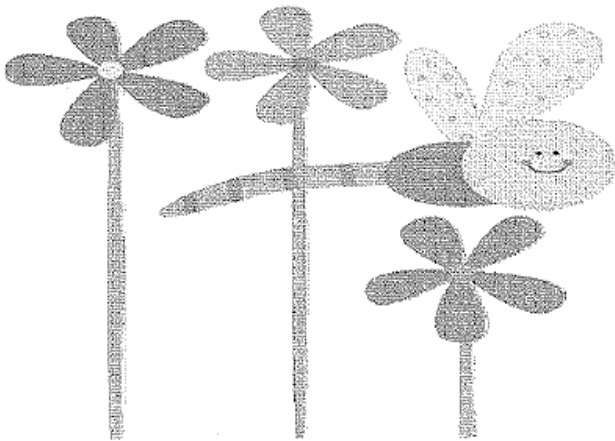
