- Meal Applications for the 17/18 school year will be available in July online or at your child's school
 - Ensure the school has an updated address and phone number
 - Only one completed application per household
 - Allow 10 business days for processing
- Meal modifications for intolerances/allergies/IEP require proper documentation with the food service department
 - Forms are available online or in your school cafeteria
 - Form must have omissions and substitutions listed
 - Form must be completed and signed by your child's medical authority
- Courtesy meals will be provided to students who forget money or have forgotten lunch at home
 - Charges will no longer be allowed for the 17/18 school year
- Sign up for ezschoolpay to add money to your child's account and/or monitor their account activity
