
Student Of The Month

First Grade

We are so proud of first grade and all the growth they have made thus far. This month in math, students will be working with data and learning how to use objects, drawings and equations with a symbol for the unknown number to represent a problem. Students will also learn how to draw comparison bars or make matching drawings to represent comparison situations. In Fundations, students will learn the difference between a blend and a digraph blend and how to read and spell common blends. We will also be learning about R controlled vowels. Please make sure your child is reading 20 minutes every night as this will help with fluency.

Kindergarten

Thank you to all of you who were able to join us for our Academic Parent Teacher Team meeting. This month in Fundations, students will continue to decode words as well as spell them. We will also retell stories by identifying the characters, setting, and main events. Please refer to your Fundations packets for specific information about activities. Don't forget to practice letter formation as well; we are still seeing some reversals! In Math Expressions, students will identify both 5 groups and ten groups. We will also talk about the partners of a number as we continue learning about simple addition and subtraction. As always, thank you for all you do to support your student's learning!

Second Grade

Animal reports were sent home and are due on February 10th. Students are able to choose any Polar Animal and complete the tri-fold papers sent home. One student from each Second Grade Class will be selected to go to the Sci-Tech Fair to share their tri-folds. Fourth Grade

Fourth grade is learning so much during the second half of the school year. In reading we began our unit of study on the Gold Rush.Fractions, fractions and more FraCtIonS...OH MY! Don't forget to utilize the Math Power books to better help your child at home when they are struggling. In social studies we are studying the exploration and settlement of Arizona from the 1500's to the mid 1800's. Be on the lookout for information about a upcoming social studies project. Lastly, in science we are exploring the magnetic world of magnetism.

Third Grade

Third graders are in LOVE with our science unit all about light and sound. As we get closer to the Sci-Tech Festival date, we have been doing experiments and discovering more about how light works and why sound waves cannot be seen normally. In writing we have been composing narratives and now we are transitioning into informative text. The students will be using their science topic of light and sound to show their expertise in the subject area. Math we have been working on elapsed time and graphs, but now we will be headed into addition and subtraction of multidigit numbers. Lastly, in reading we will be working with cause and effect, text features, and main idea and details to better understand the text/stories we read.

Sixth Grade

The sixth graders are working diligently in Math on inequalities and averages leading into mean, median and mode. ELA working on structure of literature and how to answer questions by citing evidence from the passage they have read. We completed the 700 word essays for the Gilbert Optimist Club essay contest and will soon be working on the Character Counts essay contest with the Pinal County Juvenile Court and Community Advisory Board. Science projects are in the works currently and final research report, presentation on tri-folds, and experiments due February 13th. Students created a proposal on having a dance for 6th grade and presented it to Mrs. McRae and Mrs. Kruse. They will be having a school dance on Feb. 14.
