First grade is rocking it! For Math we are learning about partners of numbers 1-10. We know that these numbers work together to play a game, solve a prob-

lem, and are two numbers that work together to make another number. In Fundations are reviewing all letters and sounds and will soon start blending the sounds. We are exploring living things during Science.



The school year has started off with lots of success. Students have been learning and practicing all the school/

classroom rules and expectations. All most all second graders have completed their Galileo and DIBELS Assessments. We will share this important information with you at the upcoming Parent Teacher Academic Night.




