Message from the Nurse

Let's talk vomiting and fevers, colds and flu. This is the time of year that they are showing up in the home and at school. I wanted to take the time to send out a reminder about the school health policies on students being sent home and for students returning to school. If a student comes in with a fever of 100 degrees or higher or vomiting they will be sent home. Students who are returning to school after or recovering from an illness must be:

- 1. 12 hours free of vomiting
- 2. 24 hours free of fever (without the use of fever reducing medicines)
- 3. 24 hours of antibiotic treatment

We want everyone to have a healthy learning environment at school and at home

Counselor's Corner

We are off and running in the new year at CTA! During the months of January and February, students participated or will participate in classroom guidance activities regarding Careers and showing Positive Behavior Choices.

Younger students were introduced to recognizing all the career options that exist. Middle aged students were asked to identify different tools for various careers. Older students completed interest inventories that spoke to career areas they may be best suited to explore. Our 6th grade students enrolled in the Arizona Career Information Systems program and now all have an online academic and activity portfolio. This portfolio is web based. Students can access it at their choosing to complete career activities, post-secondary training/education options and record all the accomplishments they earn. The portfolio is theirs to use from now until graduation from high school. The JO Combs district identified enrollment in AzCIS at the 6th grade level to support students planning for middle school and high school courses and extra-curricular activities.

Positive behavior choices in the classroom and throughout campus is a focus at CTA. Students participated in discussions on the different forms negative behavior can take; bad manners, aggression, bullying behavior. We also talked about how to assertively respond when negative behavior is around you. Ultimately, our hope is for students to show self-control over their words and actions so that respect for self and others is maintained at all times.

We see many Combs Traditional Academy students showing rigor, responsibility and respect on a daily basis. We are excited that so many of our students are earning Knights Notes and moving their way up the level of Knight!
