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The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965 requires that parents or guardians who have children attending a Title I school be notified of how well their school is preparing its students for college and/or a career, as well as the school's designation status under Georgia's ESEA Flexibility Waiver.

Under the 2015 renewal of Georgia's ESEA Flexibility Waiver, certain Title I schools continue to be designated as Reward, Priority, or Focus Schools. The Waiver allows the use of the College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) as the comprehensive report card for all schools in Georgia, providing a score between 0-100 for each school—measuring how well the school is doing in preparing its students to be successful in college and/or a career.

Clinch County Elementary School's 2015 CCRPI score was 57.7. Additional information regarding CCRPI can be found on the Georgia Department of Education's website at <http://www.gadoe.org>

I am very proud to tell you that Clinch County Elementary School has not been given a school designation this year, which means we are a Title I school that is continuing to provide a quality education to all of our students.

In addition to providing you with information regarding the performance of CCMS, all Title I schools must notify parents of their Intradistrict Transfer Rights, also known as HB251, even where no intradistrict transfer option is available. HB251 does not apply to districts with only one school at each level (i.e., one elementary, one middle, and one high school); therefore, this option is not available within Clinch County Schools.
