## **Clinch County Elementary Parent Involvement Plan For Shared Student Achievement**

**What is a Parent Involvement Plan?** This is a plan that describes how Clinch Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parental involvement in our school and support student learning. In this plan, it describes the different ways that Clinch Elementary will support parent involvement in school with activities and events that will help parents promote student learning at school and at home.

**How is this Revised?** At Clinch Elementary, parent feedback is encouraged and used to revise our plan each year. This plan is posted on our school website for parents to review and then feedback on throughout the year. We send it home with our students and place on our website an annual survey asking parents for their feedback on how we can improve our Parent Involvement here at our school. We also have a Spring and Fall Parent Feedback Night for all parents to attend with all Title I documents available .

**Who is this for?** All students and their families that participate in the Title I, Part A program, are encouraged to participate in the many opportunities that this plan describes. Clinch County Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

**Where is this available?** We will send home this plan with every student at the beginning of the school year. This plan will be posted on our website and a copy will also be kept in the Parent Resource Center.



## 2016-2017 District Goals

**District Goal #1:** The percentage of students scoring at Proficient Learner or above on the GA Milestones (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by 5%.

**District Goal #2:** The percentage of students scoring at Proficient Learner or above on the GA Milestones (GMAS) Math End of Grade Assessment will increase by 5%.

**District Goal #3:** Increase the 4-year cohort graduation rate from 87.6% to 90%.

## 2016-2017 School Goals

Clinch County Elementary School administrators & teachers have studied our student performance data to find the most important areas of improvement for our school. The school goals for 2016-2017 are:

1. Increase the number of students scoring at levels 3 and 4 on the Georgia Milestones Assessment in the areas of reading and math
2. Decrease the achievement gap between races on state mandated assessments (primarily between African American and Caucasian)
3. Increase the number of parent or family participants in family engagement programs, activities, and trainings

## School-Parent Compacts

Part of this plan is for Clinch Elementary and families to develop a school-parent compact. This compact is an agreement that parents, students and teachers develop together that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all of our students reach grade-level standards set by the state of Georgia. These compacts will be reviewed and updated every year based on feedback from our parents, students and teachers during our Annual Parent Feedback Nights. The school-parent compacts are kept with each child's teacher if a parent should need a copy.

## Parental Involvement
