


**1. What is the reason for adding an academic support program at Lassiter, and how will it help the students?** The Academic Support and Enrichment (ASE) program has been created to provide students additional assistance for their course work and high-stakes standardized testing. Enrichment opportunities are also available through ASE period, such as Leadership, Math Team, Model UN, Academic Bowl, Peer Helpers, SAT Prep, college application process, Yearbook, and Newspaper. More details on additional enrichment opportunities will be available the first week of school. In addition to the ASE program, morning and afternoon tutoring sessions will still be available for students.

**2. How have parents, students, and teachers been involved with the creation of Academic Support and Enrichment?** During the 2008/2009 school year, the staff, School Council, PTSA, administration, and student representatives were invited to participate in discussions regarding the creation of the academic support program at Lassiter.

**3. When will the ASE period take place?** The ASE period will take place three days a week between first and second periods. The seven period schedule, which has proven to be very successful at Lassiter, will remain in effect. Please see Lassiter's official bell schedule on this flier for details.

**4. Do students have a choice in what ASE period they are placed?** Students who would benefit from additional assistance in their course work or testing will be placed in an appropriate ASE period. If a student has NOT been identified as needing academic assistance he or she can sign up for an academic support class or an enrichment ASE period, such as but not limited to the options listed in question number one.



**6. How will students know if they have been academically placed in an ASE period or are able to choose an ASE class?** ASE information will be provided by each student's Advisement teacher.

**7. How will students sign up for an ASE class?** There will be a registration process that takes place during Advisement where students will sign up for a particular enrichment course. ASE will not take place the first two weeks of each semester in order for the scheduling process to occur. More details about ASE registration will be provided the first week of school and on the school website.

**8. How often will the ASE period change for a student?** A student's ASE period will change each semester, unless it would be beneficial for the student to remain in the same academic or enrichment course.

**9. Will a grade be assigned for the ASE period?** No, a grade will not be assigned for the ASE period. However, school rules will still apply for attendance and behavior.
