  - Electronic transcripts required for recommendation

 SAT/ACT not required. Use Compass exam instead.

## 2 Year Public Community Colleges

- SAT/ACT not required. Use Compass examinate
  instead.
- 2-year school: minimum. 2.0 GPA for College Prep,
- 2.2 for Technical/Career diploma
- Nearby 2-year schools: Georgia Highland, Chattahoochee Technical & Georgia Perimeter College

## **Application Fee**

#### Range from \$25 to \$100

- -Some colleges offer free admissions application (few)
- -Fee waivers for applicants from low income family

### Transcript Requests

- ANY transcript request must be requested in the Lassiter Counseling office.
  - Requires a signature to release transcript.
- First one no charge
- Subsequent requests \$2 each

## High School Transcript

#### Process in School Counseling Office

- Complete Transcript Card
- Transcript Fee
- Request 10 days to process
- Social Security # on transcript must be correct

#### **GPA**

- Overall Weighted GPA: Only meaningful to Lassiter High School!
  - All attempted classes are calculated.
  - Bonus quality points from weighted classes are included.
  - Used to determine class rank.
  - Is the GPA on a student's Lassiter transcript.
- Unweighted Academic GPA, Core GPA:
  - Only courses from English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Foreign Languages are calculated
  - Weight for honors & AP classes is removed/reduced.

#### **Test Scores**

- Submit official SAT or ACT scores
- Official test score required from CollegeBoard or ACT
- Submit SAT Subject score (if necessary)

#### **Recommendation Letters**

- Counselor, or adult in community
- Submit student profile (resume)
- Allow 2 weeks to be completed

### Teacher Recommendations

- Deal directly with the teacher!
  - Talk with the teacher to see what s/he requires from you in order to do the recommendation.
  - Provide an stamped envelope addressed to the college admissions office.
  - Follow-up with a thank-you note!

## Essay

- Private colleges may require
- Very important role in admission process
- Vivid, personal, and compelling essay (requires time & effort)

#### Interview

- Some private colleges require
- Possible to make a personal connection with someone at university

## How Colleges Calculate GPA

 Colleges and universities vary widely in the systems used to calculate the GPA they use to evaluate applicants.

The only way to be sure is to ask the college admissions office!

#### Official Test Scores

 Must be sent directly from the testing agency.

# 4 Tips for College Admissions

- Be responsible
  - Read information about your college admissions requirements
- Be organized
  - Know deadlines and maintain an admissions folder

# 4 Tips for College Admissions

- Be early
  - On time is late be early
  - Allow at least two weeks to process admissions materials
- Be relaxed
  - College admissions can be stressful
  - Read and be prepared

### Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. Do I have a better chance for admission if I apply early?
- 2. How many times should I take the SAT/ACT?
- 3. My SAT scores are low but my grades are high. Will this affect my chances for admissions?
- 4. Should I send additional material to support my admissions application?
- 5. What can I do to improve my chances for getting off the wait/deferred list?
- 6. Do colleges really care about grades in senior year?
