# Principals' Message

Last Thursday, our students were visited by a very inspirational speaker. Mr. D spoke to us about setting goals and overcoming roadblocks. He entered the gym in a wheelchair, wearing a helmet. He shared his experience of being injured during a training excursion and of his recovery process. In sharing with the students, he spoke about setting long-term goals and the shortterm goals needed to reach the long-term goals. Mr. D also shared about external and internal roadblocks that have to be overcome in order to reach the long-term goals. Then each student received a straw. They were instructed to write a long-term goal on the wrapper of the straw and to keep it somewhere it could be seen. Every time they think it's too hard to reach their goal, Mr. D told them to look at the straw and to tell themselves to "suck it up." The students listened intently to his story, and they asked very thoughtful questions when given the opportunity. At the end of the presentation, Mr. D stood up and walked out of the gym with only the aid of a cane. The students responded with genuine applause and cheered him on. Special thanks go to our school parent, Marinita Santos, for arranging this inspirational experience.

During Catholic Schools Week our faith families made fleece blankets for *Rooms of Hope*, a local organization whose mission is to support families who have children with serious illnesses. Recently we received a note of thanks for our donation of 27 fleece blankets and an article about the rooms makeovers that were prepared for Scarlette and her sister, Alisa. This young child experienced her third open heart surgery on March 9th and continues to fight for her life with much courage and strength.
