Since our reports cards in grades TK-5 will be focused on students' progress towards mastery of a specific set of standards, the report card format will no longer have letter grades. *There will be a mandatory meeting for TK-5th grade families on Wed, Nov. 9th in the Small Gym to discuss the new standard-based report cards.* During this meeting we will take the time to explain all aspects of the new standards-based reports so that you have a clear understanding of this new Diocesan system when you receive your child's first trimester report card on Wed, Nov. 30th.



Celebrating Red Ribbon Week

Red Ribbon Week is a national campaign that focuses on drug, alcohol and violence prevention.
