Dear Parents,

The January 13th edition of *The Anchor* had an article about the upcoming **Diocesan Women & Men's Conference to be held this March at Stonehill College**. *We have received more information about this including a letter from Bishop da Cunha to all parents regarding the "Thirsting for Hope – Can you drink the cup I drink? conference*. The Bishop's letter and two informational flyers are included with today's letter.

Our Middle School Science Fair is this week. Viewing of Science Fair projects is scheduled for Thursday, January 26th from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. The Science Fair judging will be held on Friday, January 27th from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m.

There is a Movie Night on Friday, January 27th for students in Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 8.

The next Upper School Dance will take place on Friday, February 10th from 6 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. If any parents or guardians would like to chaperon, please email Miss Sampson at asampson@hnsfr.org by Tuesday, February 7th.

The Holy Name Church's Finance Committee met last week to review the school's expenditures from July 1st through December 31st of this year in comparison with July 1st through December 31st of 2015. Discussions included an array of items from expected saving from the use of Solar to the expected increases to Medical coverage and salaries for employees. The Finance Committee decided that a 3% increase in tuition was needed; that increase amounts to \$115. Therefore, the tuition for students in Kindergarten through Grade 8 for the 2017-2018 school year is \$3940; the tuition for Full Day Pre-Kindergarten students is \$4640, and the tuition for Half Day Pre-Kindergarten students is \$3640. The Scholastic/Technology Fee will remain \$250.

Mrs. Chippendale has prepared re-registration forms for students in Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 7. These forms will be distributed next Tuesday, January 31st. Payment of the Scholastic/Technology Fee will guarantee a placement for the 2017-2018 school year. Holy Name School is actively advertising/recruiting for additional students for the 2017-2018 school year.

The Boston Red Sox Holy Name Family Night is scheduled for Monday, June 12th; however the deadline for purchasing a ticket or tickets is next Tuesday, January 31st. There are seat still available; an order form is included with today's letter.

A lunch form for the week of January 30th through February 3rd is enclosed. If ordering lunch or milk please return the completed form with payment by noon on Thursday, January 26th, no lunch or milk orders will be accepted after that time.

Our Fall River Fitness Challenge team - "Holy Name Heroes" – has room for more members; if you are interested in joining there is still time. Another copy of the Fitness flyer is included with today's letter.

The Fall River Little League Association City Wide Registrations for the 2017 Season for players ages 4 – 16 flyer is included with today's letter.
