We will strive to give every child what they need to make significant growth throughout the year, but we will need your help to do it. Please communicate with your child's teacher, encourage and support your child with homework, use time at home to promote learning, and see to it that your child is read to, or reads independently at home. These are just a few things that you can do to promote growth. The staff will have other ideas and resources for you throughout the year. Please never hesitate to contact us if you have questions, concerns or ideas!

Enrollment forms were sent home in Take Home Folders this week. If you have not yet returned the paperwork, please do so next week.

Be sure to "like" and "follow" Birch Grove Community School and Community Service's Facebook page and be sure to share with others! We post regularly – it can help to keep you up to date with events and activities!

Each student has been given a Take Home Folder. Please check this folder daily! Use this folder to communicate with your child's teacher, return forms and paperwork, send lunch/money, send bus passes, etc. **Take Home Folders are checked every day – backpacks are not!**

Bus passes – you must send a bus pass if you want your child to be dropped off at a stop that is not their normal stop or if your child should not ride the bus home and someone will be picking them up. Please include your child's name, the date, and where you want your child to be dropped off (or that they should not ride the bus and who will be picking them up) and put it in your child's folder. **Folders are checked every day, backpacks are not!**

Transportation – thank you for your patience as we refine our bus routes. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask. Please be at stops a little early for the first and second week! Please remind your child(ren) of what the bus rules are so that they can choose where they want to sit and not have assigned seats. We appreciate you reviewing these rules at home. Bus rules:

- **Be on time!** If there is a delay at your stop, it means a delay at every stop afterward
- Saplings parents need to board the bus and buckle their child in (K-5 should be able to buckle themselves) – please say goodbyes prior to getting on the bus so that the bus stays on time
- **Find a seat, sit down, and get buckled**
- **Stay buckled** – children may not switch seats
- Hands to self
- Use inside voices and speak to those around you (not several seats away)
- Keep the noise level down – we want the driver to concentrate on driving
- Children may take out a simple activity – coloring, reading, etc., but items need to be put away well before their bus stop
- Children may also use personal headphones for music, audio/ebooks, etc. These types of items, however, are not sharable
- Parents! Please introduce yourself to the bus driver if they do not already know you

Hot lunch is served on Mondays and Tuesdays. Cold lunch days are Wednesday, Thursday and Fridays - families send a lunch from home on cold lunch days. Hot lunch tickets are \$1.00 - \$3.00 per lunch – depending on your family’s income. Lunch and milk tickets can be paid on-line through Brightwheel – if you are not already registered, look for an email soon from Brightwheel! Students are expected to have white milk or water during lunch. You can send milk or water from home, but both are available here on site each day (milk is .50). NO POP, PLEASE OR CANDY! ☺ (Little treats that you find in a Lunchable is okay, or an occasional other little treat, but as a rule, please do not send candy as a part of your child’s lunch or snack.) Microwaves are available for heating up food at lunch time – microwaves **are not for cooking food**, only heating prepared food. Please remember to pack utensils, although we do have utensils if you forget to pack them. Also, please send a back-up lunch to be kept at school for the inevitable day that one is forgotten at home or on the bus. A back-up lunches will be kept in student lockers. Non-perishables foods should be used for back-up lunches.

Lunches can be paid on Brightwheel (preferred), but we can also accept checks. **PLEASE do not pay in cash.** Paying through Brightwheel or by check/money order are the only acceptable forms of payment. Community Lunch is held on the second Tuesday of every month at 12:00! Grandparents, siblings, family friends, and the whole community are all invited to attend. This is a great opportunity for you to have lunch with your child and your child’s friends! Community lunch tickets for adults are \$5.00

and \$3.00 for visiting children. The first Community Lunch is Tuesday, September 10 at 12:00! We hope to see you here!

Please see that your child has appropriate clothing to go outside. We have a daily 30 minute recess everyday – we also go outside for other occasions. This year, we will be starting a new program that will be held outside in the woods behind the building (more information on this later), so we will be going outside even more than we have in the past. If you need help getting outside clothing/shoes, please let us know, as we may be able to help with that.

As a reminder, we can't accept cash! Brightwheel, checks and money orders are the only form of currency we can accept. Thank you!

Building code: All parents will need a building code to enter the building as the doors to the building are locked. The old code will be changing soon! You will receive a NEW building code in the next few weeks of school. Remember to only share this code with people that are picking up or dropping off your child. When in the building, please do not open the door for anyone that rings the buzzer-school staff will answer the door.
