Be sure to "like" and "follow "Birch Grove Community School and Community Service's Facebook page and be sure to share with others! We post regularly – it can help to keep you up to date with events and activities!

Each student has been given a Take Home Folder. Please check this folder daily! Use this folder to communicate with your child's teacher, return forms and paperwork, send lunch/money, send bus passes, etc. <u>Take Home Folders are checked every day – backpacks are not!</u>

Bus passes – you must send a bus pass if you want your child to be dropped off at a stop that is not their normal stop or if your child should not ride the bus home and someone will be picking them up. Please include your child's name, the date, and where you want your child to be dropped off (or that they should not ride the bus and who will be picking them up) and put it in your child's folder. **Folders are checked every day, backpacks are not!**

Hot lunch is served on Mondays and Tuesdays. Cold lunch days are Wednesday, Thursday and Fridays - families send a lunch from home on cold lunch days. Hot lunch tickets are \$1.00 - \$3.00 per lunch – depending on your family's income. Lunch and milk tickets can be paid on-line through Brightwheel – if you are not already registered, look for an email soon from Brightwheel! Students are expected to have white milk or water during lunch. You can send milk or water from home, but both are available here on site each day (milk is .50). NO POP, PLEASE OR CANDY! © (Little treats that you find in a Lunchable is okay, or an occasional other little treat, but as a rule, please do not send candy as a part of your child's lunch or snack.) Microwaves are available for heating up food at lunch time – microwaves <u>are not for cooking food</u>, only heating prepared food. Please remember to pack utensils, although we do have utensils if you forget to pack them.

Also, please send a <u>back-up lunch</u> to be kept at school for the inevitable day that one is forgotten at home or on the bus – it has already happened this year. A <u>back-up lunches</u> will be kept in student lockers. Non-perishables foods should be used for <u>back-up</u> lunches.

Lunches can be paid on Brightwheel (preferred), but we can also accept checks. <u>PLEASE do not pay</u> <u>in cash.</u> Paying through Brightwheel or by check/money order are the only acceptable forms of payment. Please see that your child has appropriate clothing to go outside. We have a daily 30 minute recess everyday – we also go outside for other occasions. This year, we will be starting a new program that will be held outside in the woods behind the building (more information on this later), so we will be going outside even more than we have in the past. If you need help getting outside clothing/shoes, please let us know, as we may be able to help with that.

As a reminder, we can't accept cash! Brightwheel, checks and money orders are the only form of currency we can accept. Thank you!

Building code: All parents will need a building code to enter the building as the doors to the building are locked. The old code will be changing soon! You will receive a NEW building code in the next few weeks of school. Remember to only share this code with people that are picking up or dropping off your child. When in the building, please do not open the door for anyone that rings the buzzer-school staff will answer the door.

K & 1 Elementary Teacher

We are working hard in K/1st grade! We started math and reading groups this week. Students are working at different stations during math and reading times. We have also completed a poster called "All About Me." The students drew and wrote about their favorite things, family, and themselves. Check out the posters that will be hanging in the hall all year.

This week we are focusing on the letter C and A. We are learning the procedure of how we are going to learn new letters throughout the year. The students have been writing C and A, saying the C and A sound, and talking and reading about words that start with C and A. Kindergarten will be building their alphabet knowledge as the weeks go on. 1st grade will be reviewing the letters as we focus on reading and writing.

In math we are learning to write and recognize numbers. 1st grade is reviewing how to write numbers and counting up to 120. They are also are learning about partners of 5, such as 3 and 2. Kindergarten learned how to write, recognize, and count numbers 0, 1, 2, 3, and 4. Ask them to write these numbers at home, see if they remember!

4th & 5th Grade Elementary Teacher

We have had a spectacular week in 4th/5th grade! We began our math, reading, and science curriculum. In reading we have been working on summarizing stories and improving our own story telling through writing. We have been using descriptive words and a three-part story format to help us write entertaining stories. In math, we have started the year out strong. In 4th grade, we are recalling place value drawings and the different forms we can use to write our numbers, including standard form, expanded form, and written form. In 5th grade, we are continuing our exploration of fractions, diving into equivalent fractions and representing fractions on a number line. In science, our class is learning about simple machines. We have started with a few experiments, including creating a marble run and building our own levers. So much good learning is taking place!
