From The Principal's Office...

Calabasas parents,

We are already into the 4th week of school and there is much to be proud of. We have completed DIBELS testing in the lower elementary levels. We have also assessed our upper level elementary students, as well as, our middle school students using NWEA Measure of Academic Progress (MAP). Teachers have taken part in professional development related to the MAP results, and throughout the upcoming weeks, we will be using the data collected to make more informed decisions regarding our students' academic levels.

Calabasas, like the most successful schools in the nation, will begin to examine the data and provide enrichment activities for those who have met mastery, and provide re-teach experiences for those students who have not mastered the content. At Calabasas School, data drives instruction.

We are also excited to announce that we have applied for, and have been awarded, the highly competitive 21st Century Grant. This grant will allow us to ensure that we have an after school program for the following:

- An hour after school for those students who need the extra assistance to complete homework
- An hour after school for those students who are advanced / gifted to have an enriching after school STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) experience
- An hour after school for those students who are having difficulties as noted by the recently completed MAP assessments
- At least an hour after school for all students to have an engaging experience with a fun, educationally related, club

First Line of Defense FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Welcome to all new and returning families from the health offices at Calabasas. My name is Lorrie Nickel RN, school nurse. Enrique Martinez, Kiki, is the health aide at the elementary side. Martha Montenegro is the health aide at the middle school. Please call us if you have any questions or concerns. Please note the following attendance guidelines for illness. Please do not send your child to school if any of the following signs or symptoms are present during the previous 24 hours:

- Elevated temperature (100 degrees or more). Children need to be fever free for 24 hours without medication before returning to school
- Acute cold, sore throat or persistent cough
- Vomiting or diarrhea
- Pus-like discharge from the nose or eyes. Red or inflamed eyes/lids
- Suspected or untreated skin rash, impetigo, ringworm, scabies or lice
- Please contact the health office when you are not sure if your child is well enough to attend school
