**CAREER PLANNING**  
**FRESHMEN, SOPHOMORES & JUNIORS**



Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors: It is not too early to begin career planning. As you begin to think about your schedules for next year, think about what are the best classes for you to take in preparation for college. Juniors: If you have taken three years of Spanish, please sign up for fourth year as a senior. **Some** post-secondary institutions will allow four years of the same high school foreign language to meet the two-year foreign language requirement in college. You must first check with the college you are interested in attending to see what their requirements are.

## JUNIORS...EARLY ENTRY CLASSES & SENIORS-SUMMER CLASSES



Juniors who plan to enroll in any Central Community College class (Composition or other early entry classes) must have an ACT score or a COMPASS score on file at GICC before enrollment can be completed. These scores need to be given to Mrs. Rempe by **March 29<sup>th</sup>**. The last ACT test needs to be taken by February 9<sup>th</sup>. COMPASS tests are given during business hours (8:30 a.m.-5 p.m.) Contact Central Community College 398-7378 to schedule your appointment.

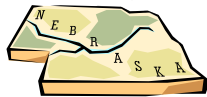
Guidelines for the summer scholarship are as follows:

The Olweus Bullying Prevention Program should be a part of GICC every year as are many of our courses. GICC has invested time, money, and energy in preparation for the beginning of this program. The committee and staff have invested quite a bit of time and energy preparing for weekly Olweus meetings with students. Randy Wiler, GICC's consultant, reminds us that this is an ongoing process which will take about two years to really become a part of Central Catholic's culture. It is important that everyone (students, staff, and parents) is open to this change and ready to move forward and continue this program. It is also important that in addition to the staff, parents and students become actively involved as well. This program is not intended to be "over." It is intended to become a part of the culture of GICC for a long time. Respect is ongoing and should be modeled every day, in school and out.

**NO COST FOR GICC STUDENTS TO REGISTER –**

**JUNIOR PARENTS- DO NOT REGISTER UNTIL YOU WILL RECEIVE YOUR JUNIOR’S REGISTRATION CODE**  
**SOPHOMORE PARENTS-PLEASE REQUEST A REGISTRATION CODE BEFORE REGISTERING YOUR CHILD.**

**SENIORS NEED TO REQUEST A FINAL TRANSCRIPT BEFORE GRADUATION.**

**A SECURE METHOD OF SENDING TRANSCRIPTS TO COLLEGES / UNIVERSITIES/ OR THE NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER or NAIA CENTER IN A SHORT TIME SPAN.**

**Mailed transcripts sometimes are not opened for a week or two, depending upon the volume of mail.**

- Complete waiver information
- Complete the Transcript Authorization Form by either entering the Parchment Registration Code or electronically signing the form
- Receive confirmation that your school has been added and begin placing transcript requests by selecting the 'Deliver' tab

4) Request delivery of your transcript to any destination worldwide

- Select the destinations, such as Academic Destinations, the NCAA, The Common Application, yourself or any other destination
- Review destinations
- Provide debit/credit card payment if there are fees associated with the request
- Receive a confirmation with the Tracking ID and next steps for your transcript request

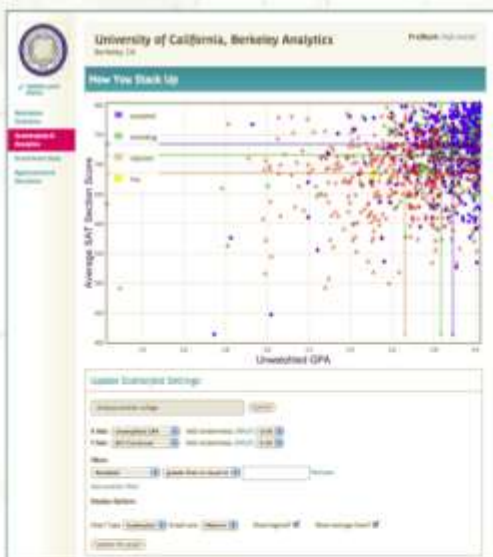

- Search for colleges and build your college list
- Keep track of your college application decisions
- Discover new colleges by seeing where students like you apply with the Parchment College Recommendation Engine™
- Ask for help and advice in the Discussion Boards

## See how you stack up.

- Complete your profile and add colleges to your list to get your data-driven Parchment predictions.
- How are these predictions created? Parchment builds statistical models from the results of students who have voluntarily added their admissions data in the past.
- On each college's page, click the "Scatterplots & Analytics" link to see a how you stack up against admitted and denied students at that college. Tip: Mouse over the dots to see actual student profiles.
- See each school's prediction accuracy by visiting the Chance Details page. In general, colleges with more data have better models.
- Predictions are probabilities. If you are given a 10% chance and you applied to a college 100 times, you should be accepted 10 of those times, if the college's model were accurate.



If you want to attend a college, you should **ALWAYS** apply. Students get in to colleges despite 0% chances. The predictions are only meant to be a guide to help you build your list.

The only way to guarantee you will not get into a college is to not apply.

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**It's FAFSA Time!**

If you're a college-bound senior, you must complete the [FAFSA](#) (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to apply for state, federal and college-based financial aid. Submit the form before your college's FAFSA priority date as some financial aid is awarded first-come, first-served. Priority dates usually fall between March 1 and April 1. To learn your college's priority date, check the financial aid section of their website or contact their financial aid office.

**Follow these steps to complete the FAFSA:**

**Complete your taxes early** as the FAFSA requires current tax information. Within three weeks after you and your parents electronically file your tax forms, your IRS data should be available to retrieve and transfer into your FAFSA. See this handout in the "[Paying for College](#)" section at **EducationQuest.org** for more details about IRS Data Retrieval.

**Gather these [student and parent items](#):**

- 2013 federal income tax forms and, if applicable, Schedule K-1 (Form 1065)
- 2013 W-2 forms
- Student's driver's license number
- Social Security numbers
- Birth dates
- Date parents were married, separated, divorced or widowed
- Current cash, savings and checking account balances
- Current investment values (stocks, bonds, mutual funds, CDs, etc.) excluding your home and retirement accounts
- Value of business (if more than 100 employees)
- Value of investment farm (Do not include the value of a family farm that you or your parents live on and operate.)
- 2013 child support (paid and/or received)
- 2013 Workers' Compensation
- Other untaxed income in 2013 such as housing/food/ living allowances for military and clergy
- Alien Registration Number for eligible non-citizens

**Be prepared to answer the following FAFSA question:**

Did you or anyone in your household receive any of the following federal benefits?

- Supplemental Security Income
- SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program)
- TANF
- Free or Reduced Price Lunch
- WIC

**Complete and file the FAFSA**

Complete and file the FAFSA at [fafsa.gov](http://fafsa.gov). The colleges you list on the application will receive the results.

Call *now* as appointments for January and February are quickly filling up.

### ACE Scholarship

Authorized by the Nebraska Legislature in 2007, the Access College Early (ACE) Scholarship Program Act (LB 192) pays tuition and mandatory fees for qualified, low-income high school students to enroll in college courses from Nebraska's colleges or universities, either through dual-enrollment or early enrollment agreements with these institutions. High school students may apply for funding under this program by completing the ACE Student Application, which is reviewed by the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education (CCPE) for award consideration.

There are two basic criteria for high school students to qualify for the ACE Scholarship. Students must either be eligible to receive assistance under a variety of federal government programs or the student and his or her family must have experienced a recent hardship. The application for the ACE Scholarship is now completely online. Below are some instructions about the process to apply. If you have questions, please see your counselor.

*To qualify for the ACE scholarship, you need to qualify for at least one of the following federal benefit programs: Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Food Stamps, Free and Reduced Lunch, Special Supplemental Nutrition Program (WIC), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Other Extreme Hardship.*
