## Office of Early Academic Outreach

The mission of the Office of Early Academic Outreach at the University of Arizona is to increase the number of \*ethnic minority, low-income, and first-generation college-bound students who are eligible to enter a degree program at a university. Programs provided include Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA), Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP), Building the Future, Native American Science and Engineering Program (NASEP), College Academy for Parents, and Algebra Academy.

## Native American Science and Engineering Program (NASEP)

NASEP is a part of the Office of Early Academic Outreach at the University of Arizona. The Office of Early Academic Outreach partners with The University of Alaska-Anchorage in the Indigenous Alliance in an attempt to effect a systematic change in the hiring patterns on Indigenous Americans in STEM fields. NASEP is a year-long program designed to provide Native American high school students with a vision of a career in a Science, Technology, Engineering, or Mathematics (STEM) field.
