DAYDREAMS OF A PASTOR... Arthur John Grisham has written a hilarious little book entitled Skipping Christmas. Judging from the people who have told me that they have read it, it seems that it has almost become a classic. It is the story of a couple whose home is now empty. Their child has gone off to college and so they decide to leave home for Christmas. The novel revolves around their trying to avoid all the work that goes into preparing and celebrating Christmas as a social, rather than a truly religious, event.

I am writing this letter to you for the Sunday after Thanksgiving, when the secular machinery that drives Christmas, namely commerce, will be in full gear. Since it is so short but so significant a time, I want to warn you not to miss Advent. Or worse still, please do not skip Advent!

What am I trying to say? It takes a great deal of focus, energy and effort to keep from getting pulled in to the whirlwind that precedes the feast of the birth of our Savior. You know this as well as I do. The "good" parts of getting ready for Christmas that can flow from love and faith, such as getting gifts and sending cards to loved ones, are swept away by the "bad" parts: the countless expectations that fall upon us from the culture of materialism. What then can one do to stand against the rising tide of getting and spending? It is great to give gifts and celebrate with parties but never forget the reason for the season.

THE BIRTH OF JESUS

Advent did not emerge in the early church as the antidote to the absolute worldliness that we know today. But it did derive from Jesus" teaching that the world around us is in fact passing away. He promised to come again to save those who remained faithful to Him. We do not know the day or time set for His coming. But Christians at that time were enjoined to live in the world with their hearts set on another world. Christians today are still so encouraged. So, please don't skip Advent. It offers you shelter and peace in the beautiful readings of the Scriptures and in prayers and rituals (e.g./ the Advent wreath. Pageants, Advent Candles) that appeal to the heart's deepest longing to live for something more than what the world can offer.

Join us for Mass on Sunday, even on a weekday, and take time during the week to read Scripture and pray. Join us for our two Christmas Pageants. Seek peace in God's mercy through

The Sacrament of Reconciliation. In the spirit of giving remember those in need such as the Year End Campaign

There are so many ways to keep focused on the Lord as we await his coming. So, whatever you do, please don't skip Advent...or Christmas!
