- January 27th is also a dress down Friday for faculty and students. We will be collecting cat and dog food for the St. Francis of Assisi Food Pantry.
- Mr. Henry Fiore sent all principals the following important message concerning: School Green Cleaning Products law Compliance Resource. It was sent from the Department of Health and Mr. Fiore urges all of us to comply with the law. He indicated that the Failure to comply with the law could result in a major liability for our schools. The Departments of Public Health and Energy and Environmental protection are working together to encourage CT school districts to post a link on their web to the Waste Busters Green Cleaning Myths video. The video was produced by CT DEEP, in conjunction with their agency. They are requesting that all staff, parents and students to view the video. The main purpose of the video is to getting staff and parents to comply with the 2009 CT School Green Cleaning Products Law (Conn. Gen. Stat. Sections 10-220[a], 10-231 [g] which clearly state 'No parent, guardian, teacher or staff member may bring into the school facility any consumer product which is intended to clean, deodorize, sanitize or disinfect." All teachers and other staff members will have access to the

general green cleaner used by the custodial staff. Reducing exposure to traditional cleaners is part of efforts to reduce asthma triggers in schools. The custodian staff will have a fact sheet on the Green Cleaning products Law.

Last year, the Foundation awarded 193 students a total of \$99,750.00. This year, the online applications will be accepted beginning on January 1, 2017 through March 6, 2017. Please submit all the information required from FACTS because if the applications are not fully complete FACTS cannot verify the information. This information has been provided by Mary Ellen Mahoney from the Norwich Development office.
- We had another budget meeting on Wednesday, January 11th. There is another budget meeting scheduled for February 9th. The budget needs school board approval and review of finances. Following school board approval, Deacon Rene and I will hold a parent meeting to review the budget and its impact on families.
