No More Mandatory Fundraising!

Historically, St. James School has raised significant funds through the Bazaar and its other Development events. Families were required to raise \$500 each year and serve 5 hours staffing the Bazaar each summer season. If these requirements were not met, then a bill was sent out in the spring for whatever monies were not raised, and scholarship could hinge on whether or not someone participated in the Bazaar. The process of fundraising took precious time and energy away from the family structures we say that we so value as a Catholic community. It also took time and resources on the school side, to administer.

Often it was heard that families would just prefer to write a check and be done. No more hassles or guilt. So, this is the trade off; the hard part of my message today is to tell you that tuition <u>is</u> going up.

How are families who are already struggling and sacrificing going to be able to make up the difference to cover the jump in monthly payments? Well, the answer is still fundraising and scholarship. The structuring of it will simply be a little different. On page two of this newsletter, is an outline that describes the process in greater detail.

So what does all of this mean going forward?

- No family NEEDS to do fundraising, though the opportunities to lower your tuition will still be there.
- The Bazaar will not disappear completely. It will evolve in new directions, however.
- There WILL still be fundraising events in which families can participate to meet the criteria for financial aid, but all are voluntary.
- An activity fee structure will be put in place for middle school students to offset the need for nonstop fundraising and dues for the eighth grade year.

- The best strategy for lowering tuition costs is still to attend Mass and use your contribution envelopes to show your attendance. (It's also a great way to say thank you to God for the blessing of a beautiful, safe place that your children go to school, and to model the faith for them!)
- Registration fees for new families will stay the same, but those for current families will actually go DOWN.
- Registration forms will go out in hard copy during Catholic Schools Week, but they will also be available online.

These changes are big, but really, the new structure will give financial strength and hopefully leave families feeling less hampered by the need to fundraise.

TUITION 2016-2017

Our tuition for the 2016-2017 school year is \$4,000.00 for students in grades K-8. The rate of \$4,000.00 is <u>BEFORE</u> any parish subsidy and diocesan as well as local financial aid. A \$200.00 tuition credit per family for 10 hours of volunteering your "time & talent" to St. James School will also be available. Subsidies, financial aid, and any credits are applied towards tuition <u>AFTER</u> approval and/or obligations have been met.

Tuition before credits:\$4,000.00

Volunteer Credit:\$ 200.00 (credit is per family in K-8)

Multiple Child Credit is reflected below.

Family with Two children:.....\$7,250.00

Family with Three children:\$9,850.00

Registration fees: Initial: \$325.00 Re-registration: \$150.00

Activity fee: Students in grade 6-7-8: \$100.00 each year

PRESCHOOL RATES are as follows:

Five full days:\$5,500.00

FINANCIAL AID OPTIONS

To qualify for financial aid, you must:

- demonstrate financial need within the Diocesan guidelines.
- actively support and attend your Parish Church and have written approval on file from your pastor.
- complete the financial aid application each year.
- have met all financial requirements of the previous school year.
- volunteer credits will be applied upon completion for next school year.
