

Scholarship Abstract

Title: Rotary Club of the Verde Valley Academic Scholarship

Description: The Rotary Club of the Verde Valley in its endeavor to provide community service has over the years granted scholarships to graduating seniors from both Mingus Union and Camp Verde High Schools. The award for Mingus students is the Casey and Lucey Schwab Memorial Award. They will be granting One (1) - \$4,000 academic scholarship (\$1,000 per year) to Mingus graduating seniors this year.

Eligibilities: Graduating high school senior that is in the top **11-25** percent of the graduating class. This is a needs based scholarship.

To Apply: Complete and submit the following information to the Counseling office:

- Academic application (Can NOT apply for the vocational scholarship)
- A Personal Statement telling about yourself, why you want to continue your education, your career goals and how receiving this scholarship will impact your future ambitions. The essay should be no more than 250 words. (Be sure to include financial need information.)
- A letter of recommendation from your principal or counselor AND a letter of recommendation from a teacher.
- Two letters of recommendation from people not related to you who know you.
- Official transcript.

Deadline: Bring your application materials to the Counseling office no later than March 31.
*Must meet application deadline and complete an interview with the Rotary Club of the Verde Valley scholarship committee.
