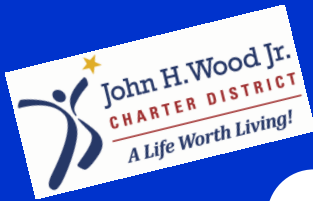

The School's Responsibilities

- Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment *that inspires student's to create a life worth living.*
- Enable students to meet the State's academic achievement standards by providing:
 - Individualized intensive instructional programming for all students
 - A unique teaching approach that is rigorous and engaging
 - Extended learning as well as credit recovery opportunities
 - Opportunities to access, understand, and use technology-based tools
- Implement positive behavior support that will encourage students to develop and practice appropriate behaviors.
- Conduct Site-Based Decision-Making Committee Meetings to involve parents, surrogate parents, and facility representatives in the development of the schoolwide plan including the process of school review and improvement.
- Provide parents, surrogate parents, and facility representatives with timely access to student information and frequent reports of their student's progress.
- Provide parents, surrogate parents, and facility representatives with reasonable access to school staff.
- Understands that the school's responsibility to their students does not end when they leave. Timely information, reports, and transition services will be provided to the receiving school.

The Parent's Responsibilities

- Monitor my student's progress and completion of school work.
- Participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my student's education.
- Stay informed about my student's education, attendance and behavior and communicate with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school and responding, as appropriate.
