Building Improvements

Work crews didn't break for the holidays. They finished the complete makeover of the student restrooms, added the covered porches to both the office building and the computer lab, laid the pipes for the irrigation system and prepared the area for grass, and they poured the concrete walkways, basketball court, front bumper parking areas. Attendance

We had 5 students who worked on their coursework over the holiday and a total of three courses were completed. Our students have come to understand how our policies are designed to help them complete and there has been an overall positive reaction.

I'm Ready

Principal Draper drew the line at the front of the entrance to the school. The **I'm ready** line is the spot he has marked for students to put their personal problems behind them and concentrate on completing their degree. If a student acts in a manner that proves they are not ready, Mr. Draper will escort that student back to the line and they will start again. In the first semester, we have had no major infraction of the rules the student and their parent/guardian signed off on and this semester is off to a continuation of that mature behavior displayed by our students in the first semester.

Completers

Katrina Cutter, Ernestine Ailak, Cheyenne King, Jerrica Hinton, Dominic Newman, Erik Steele, and Brandi Logan have all completed their missing credits and will be graduating in May with the Secondary. We have several students who are close to completion and expect that two will finish in early January.

Exercise/Intermural Teams

Principal Draper switches hats to his previous position as a PE coach. He is concerned that our students are not active and has identified the short break periods as insufficient to address the problem. We are asking our students for suggestions that might include lumping all of the breaks into one 20 minute period and provide basketballs for boys/girls intermural team, perhaps volleyball and he has already driven the stakes for horseshoes. As the construction team completes their work, we will begin our programs for a more balanced educational experience.
