San Carlos Unified School District experienced February Madness! What a great way to end the basketball season – Lady Braves in the final four and Braves take the state title! Congratulations! What better way to bring a community together! One of the great things to come out of this championship season is the positive behaviors exhibited on and off the basketball court by our students, staff and parents. Feedback from those that presented the state tournament was praise for behaviors exhibited by players and fans from San Carlos. Our girls and boys showed great sportsmanship throughout the season and post-season. So...riding on the wave of those positive comments...we need to use this to our advantage to show our students, staff and community that positive things can, and will happen when you set a goal! Our basketball players did not just run out on the basketball court and win game after game. They practiced – a lot – and they maintained passing grades in order to stay on the team. They are the role-models for our younger students. Great job to all of the players – both boys and girls – and to your coaches, teachers and parents for the sacrifices they made throughout the season so you could be part of history being made in San Carlos. You have heard the expression – “There is no ‘I’ in team”. This victory represents that statement.

In the world of PBIS, our external evaluator's presented mid-year data findings to the SCTG/PBIS District Leadership Team on March 3rd. In comparison to last year, our Attendance is up slightly, but not on target with projections made at the beginning of the grant. Suspensions continue to

be an area of concern. Building teams will address these two issues head-on and build on the supports and interventions already in place in these two areas. The third area measured is Office Discipline Referrals (ODR's). In this area we surpassed expectations and are well below our target number. This tells us that Tier 1 interventions have proven successful. We want to continue to focus on Tier 1 interventions to ensure continued success with decreasing our ODR numbers, but will start to introduce additional strategies for those students who are chronically truant and those that require either in-school or out-of-school suspensions. Additional Tier 2 interventions have been introduced during KOI Training Academies (three thus far this year) and will be added to current interventions for student's who require more than Tier 1 intervention. Our final training will be on Saturday, April 30th.

As we move on to the end of quarter 3 and start of quarter 4, we need to look at the successes and accomplishments attained during the first three quarters of the school year. Much has been learned through trial and error, which provides us with opportunity to improve and build upon the positive efforts made by students, staff and community. Attendance continues to be a primary concern, as no instruction or intervention will work if the student is not in school! Please ensure that students are consistently in school! Thank you!
