Addendum to the Oakwood Student Handbook

Oakwood ISD is committed to portraying our students with a positive image by teaching them the importance of personal appearance at school and school functions. The following school rules/consequences are being implemented effective immediately.

Dress Code violations has been updated

From:

If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code:

1. The student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school.
2. A parent or designee may bring an acceptable change of clothing to the school.
3. If not corrected, the student may be assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until the problem is corrected.

Repeated offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.

To:

If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code:

1. The student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school.
2. A parent or designee may bring an acceptable change of clothing to the school.

Levels of consequences:

1st offense – written warning and fix the problem

2nd offense – fix the problem, parent notified, and 1 lunch detention

3rd offense – fix the problem, parent notified, 2 lunch and 1 after school detentions

4th offense – fix the problem, parent notified, 5 after school detentions

Student may fix the problem by:

- The student can fix the problem and go back to class.
- If the student cannot fix the problem, the parent may be called to bring something to fix the problem.
- If the previous two steps fail, then the student will be sent to ISS for the remainder of the day.
