## St. Rita School Legacy 1956-2000

- 1956 Opened with 240 children in grades 1-4
- 1959 Enrollment had grown to 440 students in grades 1-6
- 1980 Half-day Kindergarten was added as a pilot program. Became a regular offering in 1981
- 1990 Kindergarten program expanded with full- or half-day options
- 1992 Pre-K 3 & 4 programs added
- 1995 Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus come to St. Rita School
- 1997 Computer lab, 2 new classrooms and a handicap entrance added to the school building

## St. Rita School Legacy 2001-Present

- 2001 Fully-equipped science lab, art room, renovated library and media center added to school building.
- 2007 Major technology upgrade including new work stations & servers in computer lab and the installation of wireless access throughout the building.
- 2013 Each classroom was equipped with 4-5 iPads. Grade 8 began 1:1 iPad initiative.
- **2014** Grade 7 began 1:1 iPad initiative.
- 2015 new Chrome Computer lab opened. Grade 6 began 1:1 iPad initiative. All-day Pre-K 4 program added. Spanish language instruction added in Grade 2.





## Financial Breakdown Income








### Cost per Pupil—Public School




## Neighboring School Tuition




#### Enrollment




#### **Tuition Breakdown**
